Introduction to the ASQ-3: Developmental Screening Tool

This introductory webinar is an interactive live training for professionals who want to learn how to accurately score and interpret the ASQ-3 (third edition, developed in 1990), a developmental screening tool.

Objectives: After this session participants will:

- Understand why using any screening tool is recommended and the difference between screening and assessment
- Identify the components of the ASQ-3 questionnaire and accurately choose the correct questionnaire for the child
- Accurately score the ASQ-3
- Begin to develop strategies to communicate the purpose of developmental screening to families
- Begin to integrate The Four Considerations for interpretation of scores and making referrals

Introduction to the ASQ-SE2: Social Emotional Screening Tool

This introductory webinar is an interactive live training for professionals who want to learn how to accurately score and interpret the ASQ-SE2 (second edition, developed in 2015), a social emotional screening tool. You do not need to take the ASQ-3 first if you are familiar with accurately scoring that tool.

Objectives: After this session participants will:

- Understand why it is recommended to screen social emotional
- Begin to develop strategies to communicate the purpose of social-emotional screening to families
- Accurately choose the correct questionnaire for the child
- Accurately score the questionnaire
- Understand The Four Considerations for interpretation
- Understand tools to help you approach parents with follow up and referral

Professionals who would like to enhance their knowledge and skills in developmental and social-emotional screening using the ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE2 including:

- Local Public Health and Tribal Health Nurses (PHNs)
- Family Home Visitors

- Professionals involved in providing Child & Teen Check Ups (C&TC) outreach or screening services
- Primary healthcare providers, clinic staff and administrators
- Other screening program staff including Head Start and Early Childhood Screening programs
