

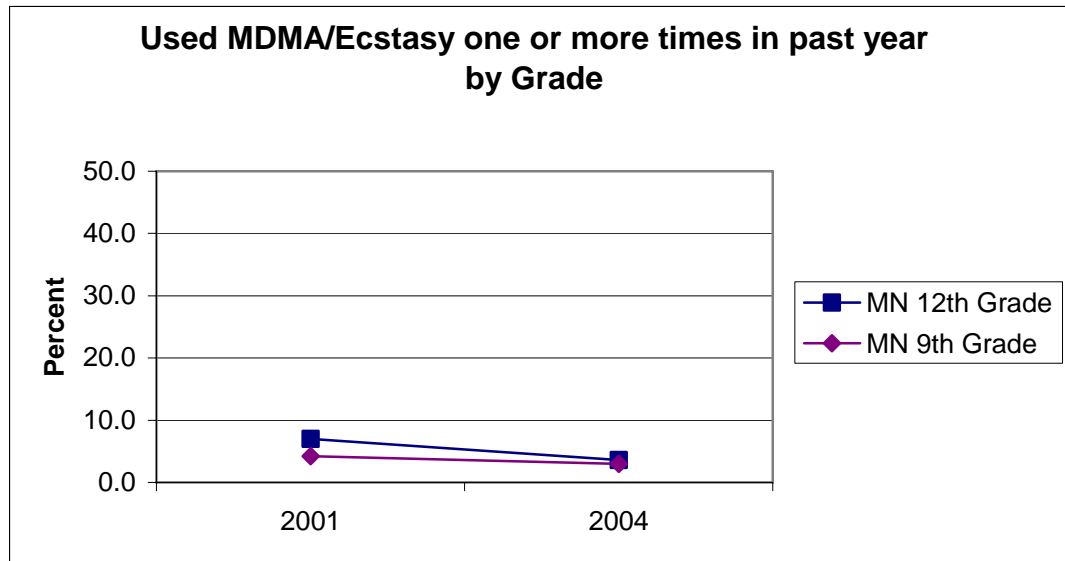
Youth Use of MDMA/Ecstasy

Youth were asked, “On how many occasions (if any) have you used MDMA (“ecstasy”)... during the last 12 months?”

In 2004, three percent of 9th grade students and almost four percent of 12th grade students reported using MDMA or ecstasy at least once in the past year. Twelfth grade students were slightly more likely to report use than 9th grade students. For both grades, reported use of MDMA/ecstasy has declined between 2001 and 2004.

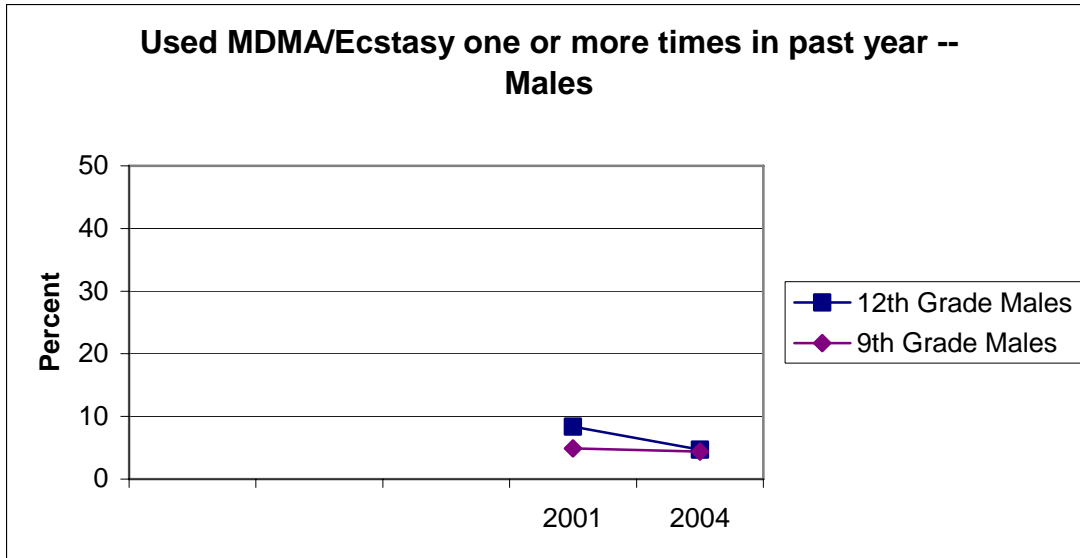
Males are more likely than females to report using MDMA/ecstasy in the past year.

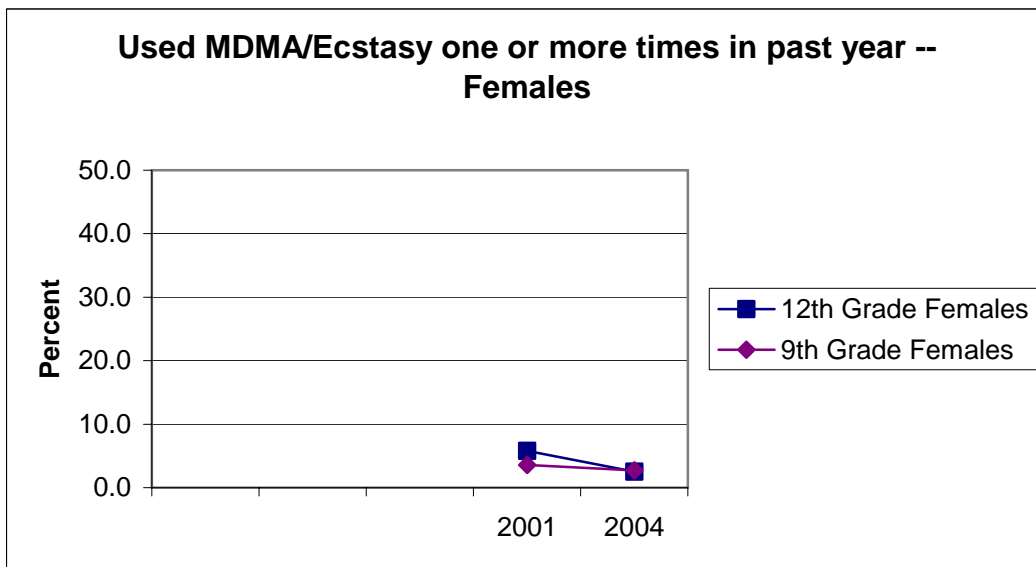
