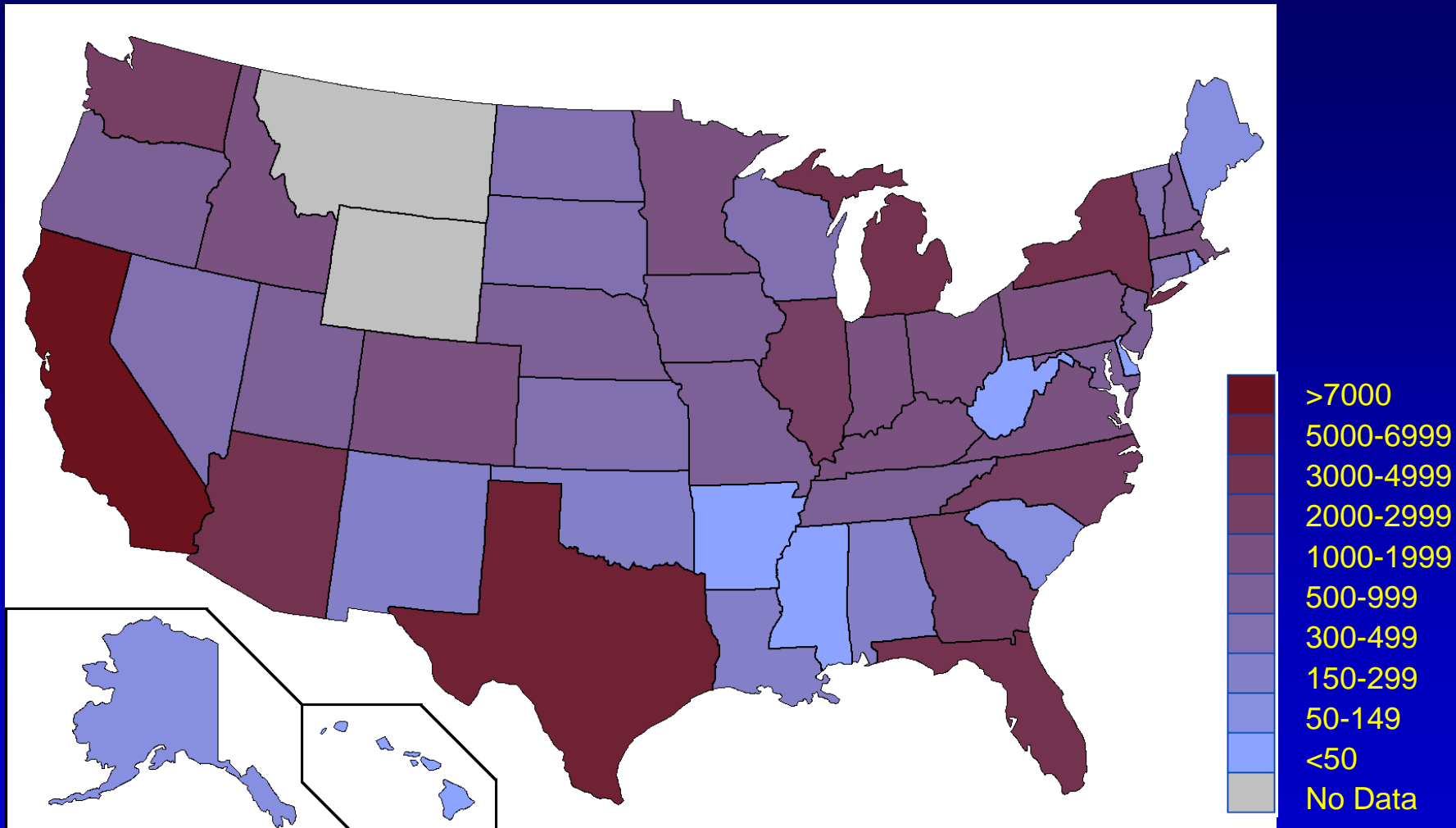

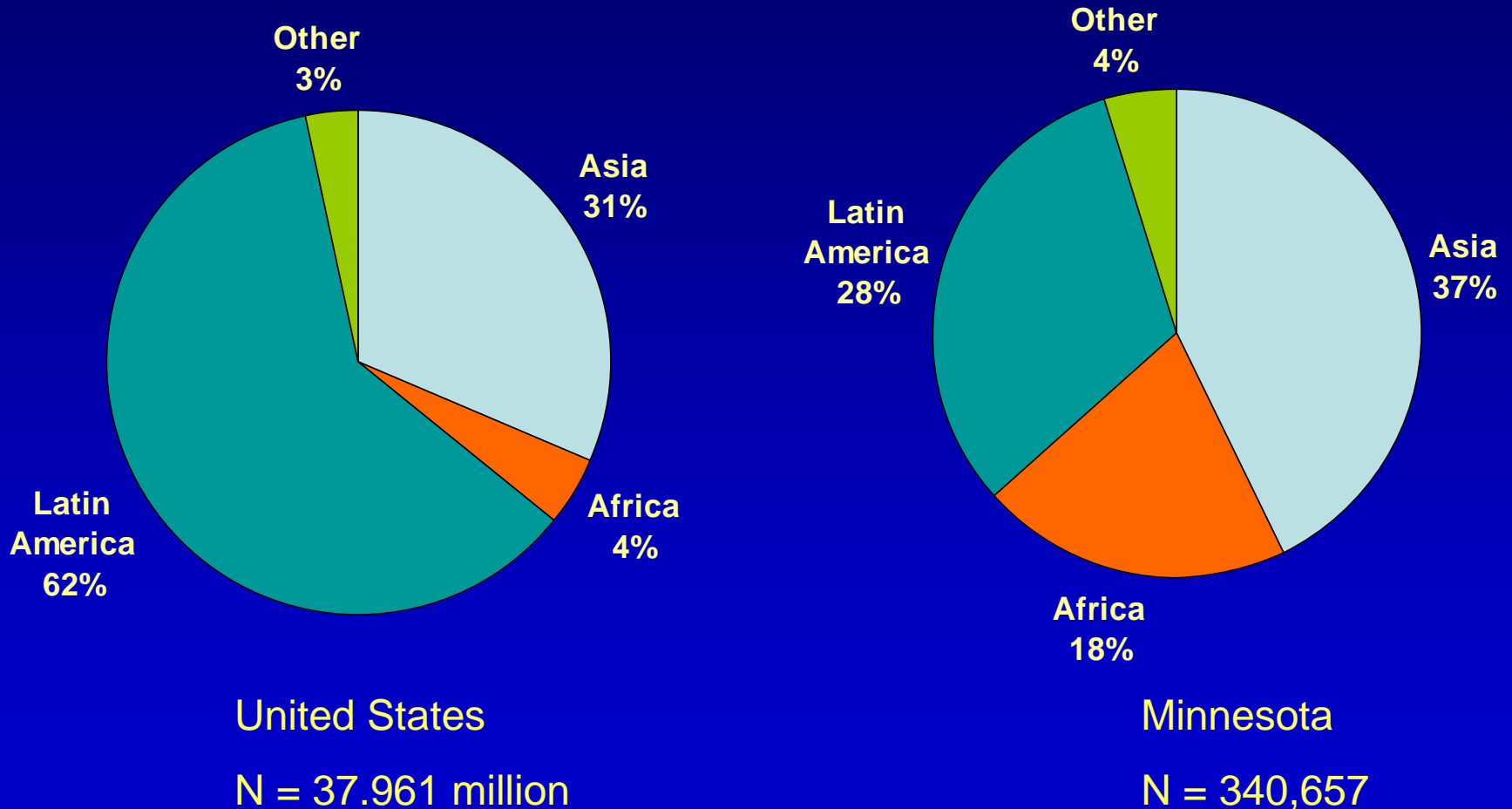

# Primary Refugee Arrivals by State of Initial Resettlement, Fiscal Year 2008

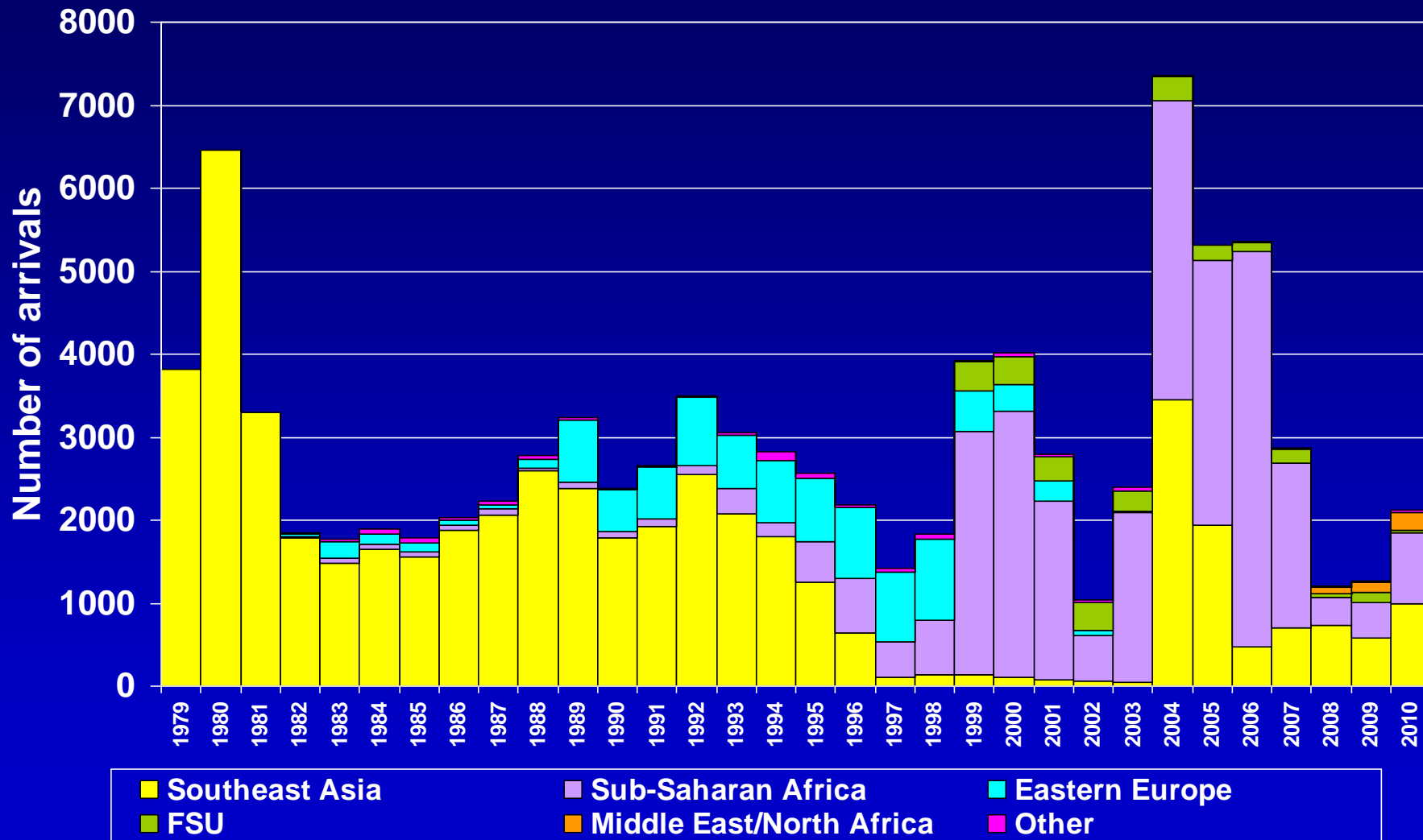

# Distribution of Foreign-Born Populations by Region of Origin, U.S and MN, 2008

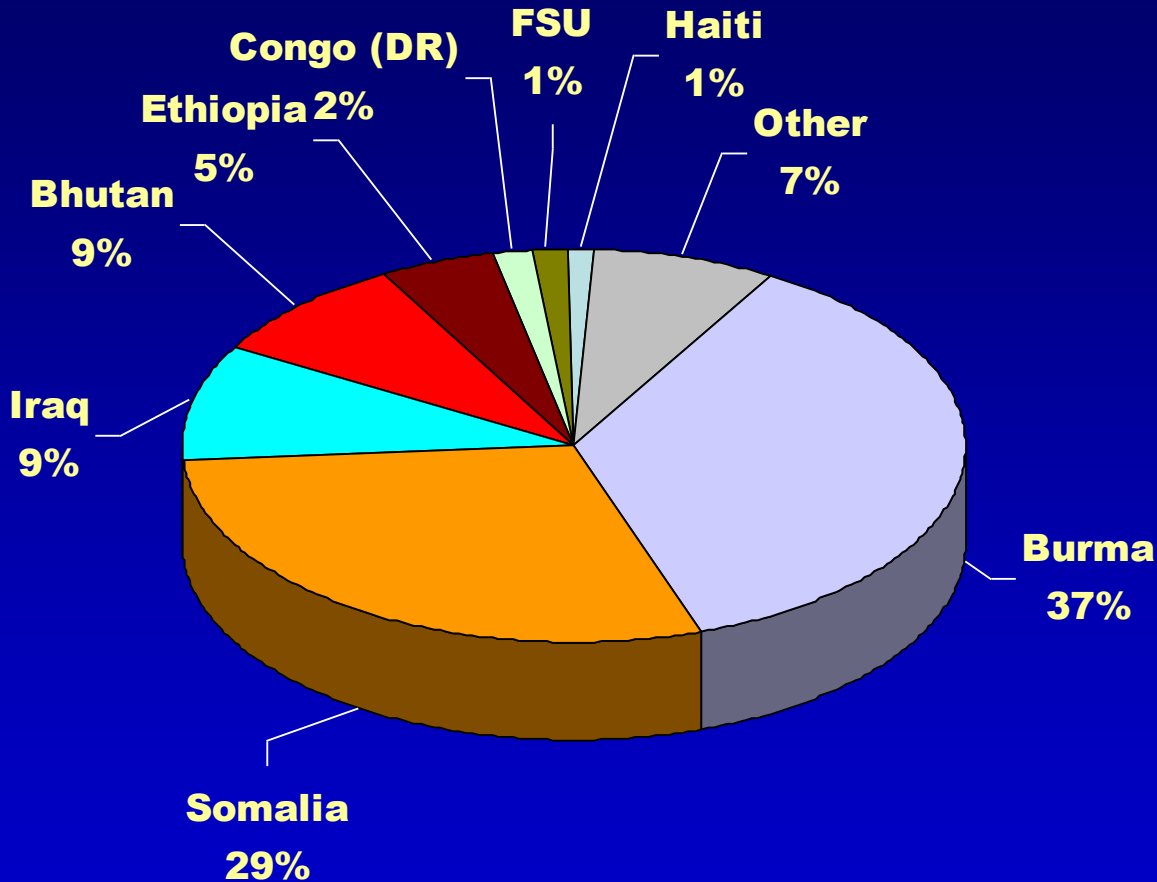


# Refugee Arrivals to MN by Region of World 1979-2010\*

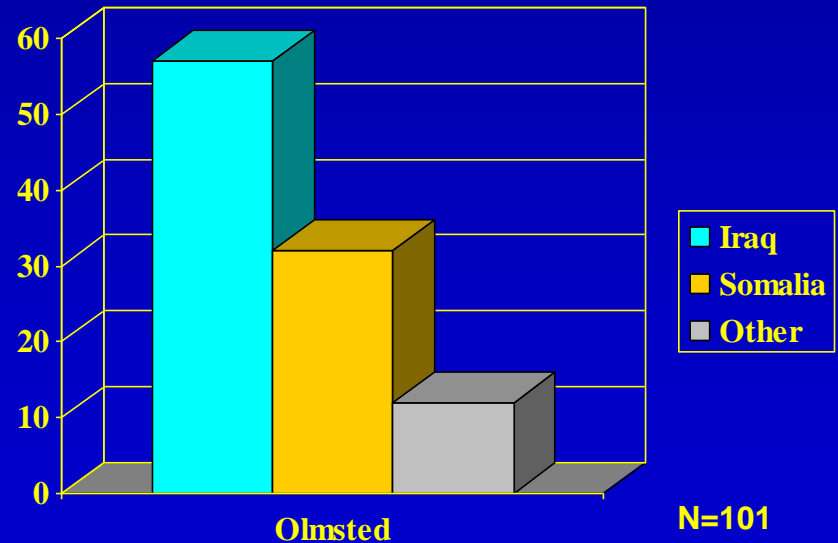
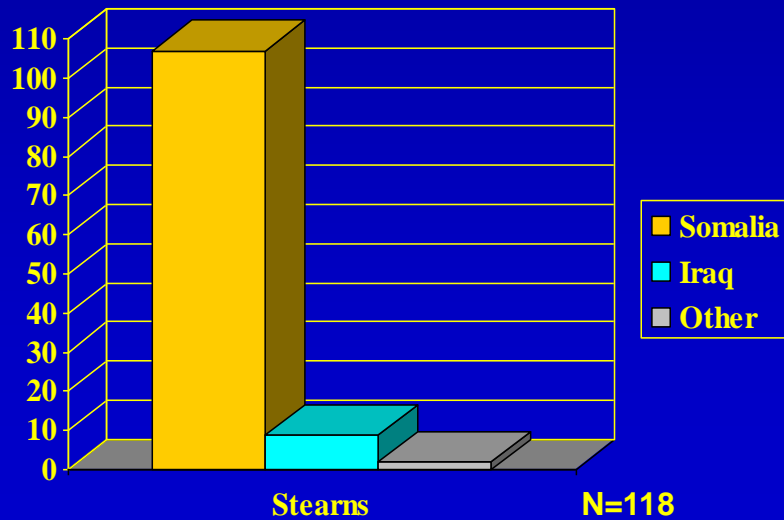
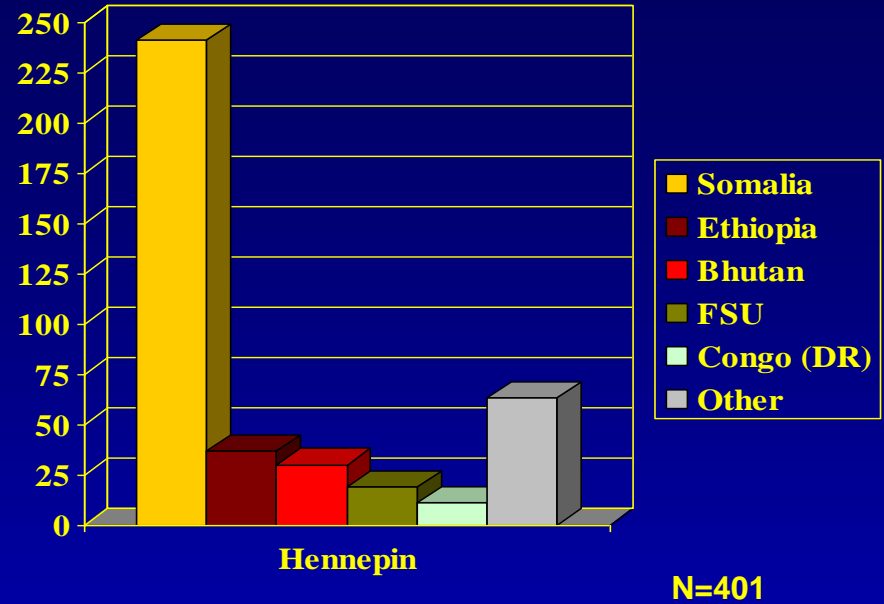
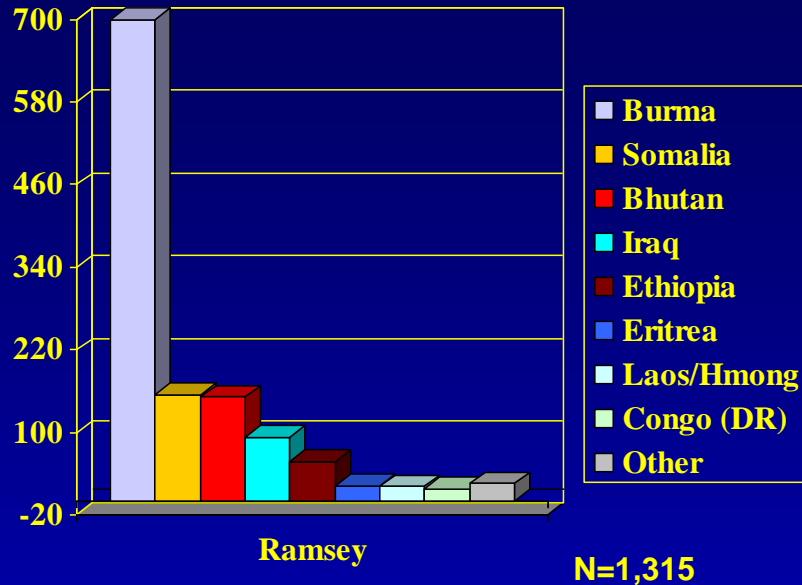

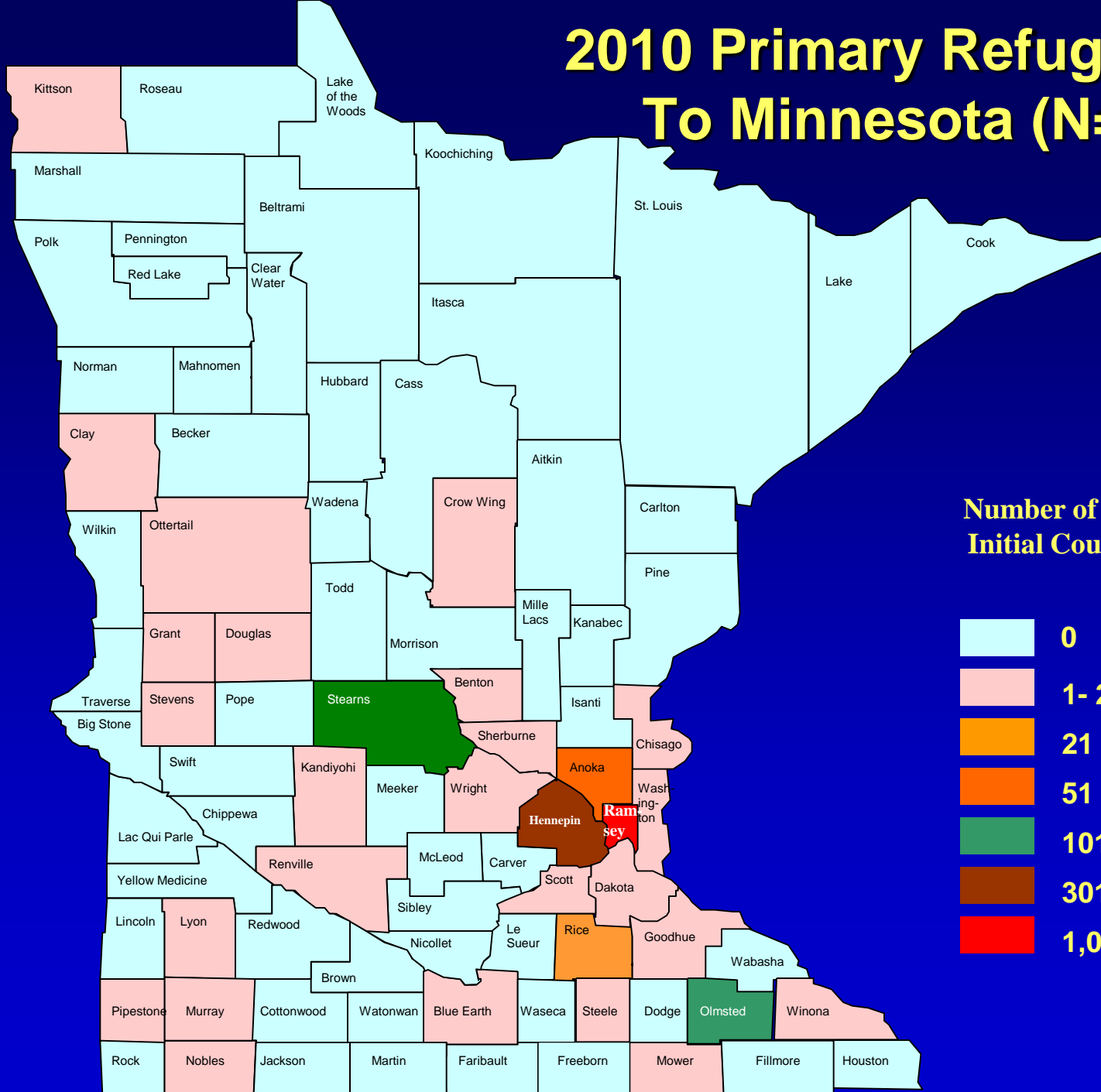

# Country of Origin by County of Resettlement, 2010\*



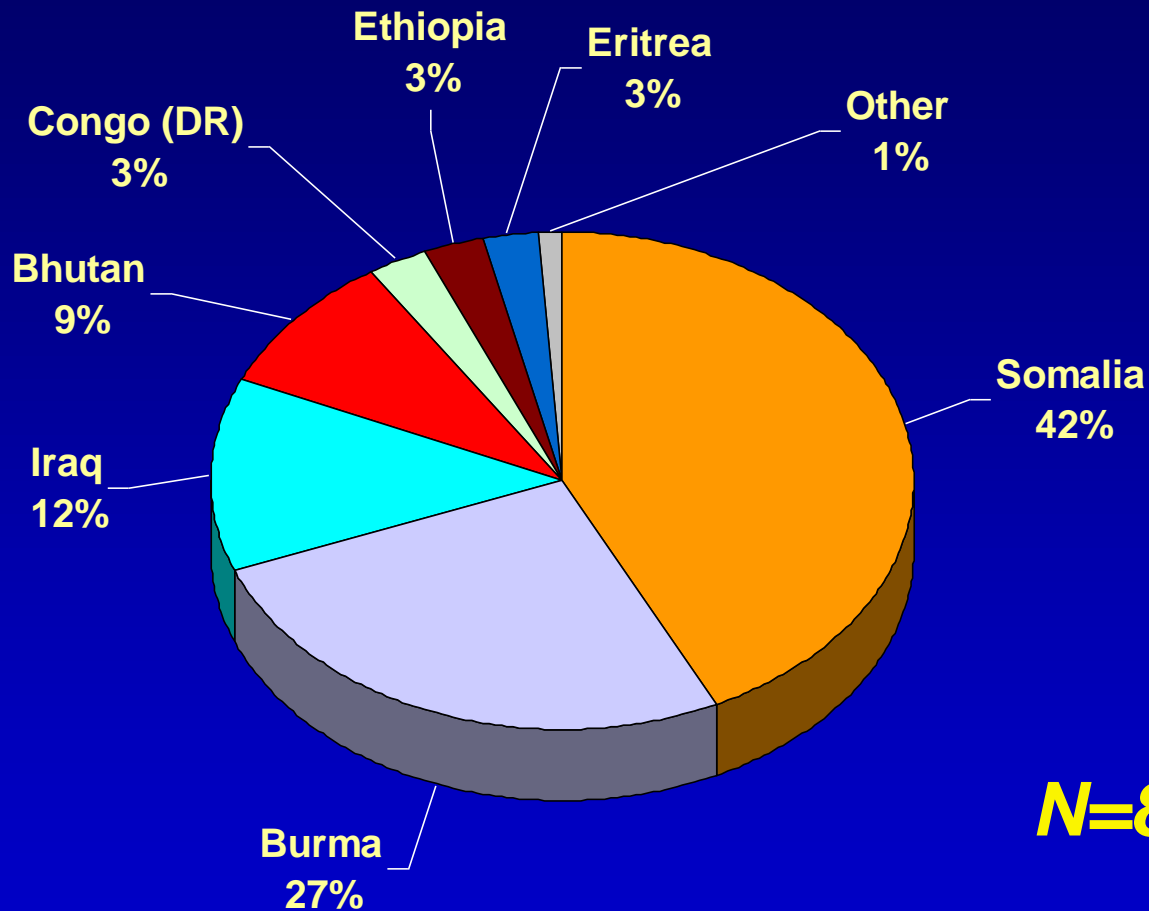
# 2010 Primary Refugee Arrival To Minnesota (N=2,122)
