Coon Rapids	North Metro Pediatrics	\$45,000	Provide services to low-income uninsured and underinsured children in Anoka County.
Madelia	Apple Tree Dental	\$45,000	Enhance existing clinical operations in Madelia, supporting salaries and replacing non-functioning equipment.
Mankato	Open Door Health Center	\$45,000	Support medical interpreter/Community Health Worker to enhance services to a largely low-income, uninsured Latino patient base.
Minneapolis	American Indian Community Development Corp	\$45,000	KOLA clinic targets stationary and mobile clinical services to American Indian adults, who are chronically homeless, inebriated. Many are also mentally ill.
Minneapolis	Fremont Community Health Service	\$45,000	Support clinical and interpreter services for large uninsured and growing non-English speaking population.
Minneapolis	Children's Dental Services	\$45,000	Increase dental services to low-income uninsured and underinsured children.
Minneapolis	Community University Health Care Center	\$45,000	Reposition front desk staff to bilingual patient representatives to decrease interpreter time and greatly increase the efficiency of check-in and patient assistance.
Minneapolis	Indian Health Board of Minneapolis	\$45,000	Provide on-site psychiatric services on a sliding fee basis to an ethnically diverse and low-income patient population, including a high percentage of American Indians.
Minneapolis	Native American Community Clinic	\$45,000	Support prenatal case manager and patient advocate, targeting low-income American Indian populations to increase health outcomes related to chemical use during pregnancy and connect patients with a broad source of community support programs.
Moorhead	Family HealthCare Center	\$14,000	Support practice management software program to improve the clinics ability to serve the targeted low-income patients and improve sustainability.
Red Wing	Planned Parenthood	\$13,000	Facility improvements in Red Wing site adding air conditioning so that services may be provided year-round without risk of closure due to heat.
St. Paul	Face to Face Health and Counseling	\$45,000	Provide medical services to uninsured and underinsured adolescents and young adults in St. Paul and Ramsey County, targeting low-income and minority youth.
St. Paul	Open Cities Health Center	\$45,000	Support an African American social worker and a Hmong social worker, ethnicities that represent significant portions of the patient base.
Apple Valley	St. Mary's Health Clinics	\$45,000	Support services at Apple Valley Clinic, targeting uninsured populations and a growing Hispanic population.
