

## 2009 Community Clinic Grant Program Award Summary

Coon Rapids	North Metro Pediatrics	\$21,000	Increase access to health care for children, targeting uninsured/underinsured pediatric patients in Anoka County, which has a growing population with low incomes.
Duluth	Lake Superior Community Health Center	\$45,000	Support preventative/restorative dental care to uninsured children from families with low to moderate incomes and low-income diabetic patients in need of dental services.
Duluth (5-county arrowhead region)	Women's Health Center of Duluth	\$45,000	Provide sexually transmitted infection screening to uninsured/high risk populations under the age of 25 at all appointments and upon request or with symptoms to patients over age 25.
Fergus Falls	Apple Tree Dental	\$45,000	Support the establishment of a new dental clinic in Fergus Falls where a Department of Human Services dental clinic recently shifted focus to provide care for only people with disabilities.
Maplewood	Community Dental Care	\$45,000	Expand existing East Metro dental outreach and education program for minority children and pregnant women.
Minneapolis	American Indian Community Development Corp	\$45,000	Support KOLA, a street-based health outreach and medical services for chronically homeless and alcoholic Native Americans.
Minneapolis	Fremont Community Health Services	\$22,500	Offset costs related to staff training, infrastructure and equipment to implement electronic medical records.
Minneapolis	Indian Health Board (IHB)	\$22,500	Provide psychiatric services on site, targeting uninsured/underinsured and primarily Native American patients.
Minneapolis	N.I.P. Community Clinic	\$45,000	Offset costs to providing health care services for uninsured target population.
Nett Lake	Bois Forte Health Services	\$45,000	Enhance services for Native American patients with diabetes through the creation of a Case Management System.
St. Paul	Face to Face Health and Counseling	\$45,000	Offset uncompensated care costs for services to low income, uninsured teens and young adults.
St. Paul	St. Mary's Health Clinics	\$45,000	Offset expenses in providing health care services to uninsured patients at East Side clinic serving Payne-Phalen and Dayton's Bluff Neighborhoods.
Winona	Semcac Family Planning Clinic	\$45,000	Support costs for medical supplies/equipment, lab fees and outreach/education for targeted population with low incomes.
Worthington (project in Montevideo and Ortonville)	Southwestern MN Opportunity Council (SMOC)	\$45,000	Support expansion of family planning services into Big Stone, Chippewa, Lac qui Parle, Swift and Yellow Medicine counties.
