COURSE GOAL

Enhance and improve the preparedness of Minnesota hospitals and healthcare facilities by providing education from lessons learned to providers and other members of the preparedness team. The educational experience will include review of didactic information relevant to the planning and care practices of all involved in preparedness planning.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This activity is planned for Physicians, EMS Personnel, Public Safety, Local and State Health Departments, Nurses, Behavioral Health Personnel, Emergency Managers, and Homeland Security Emergency Management.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Following this activity, participants should be able to:

1. Apply lessons learned from initial and subsequent (72-96) hour hospital disaster responses while relying on emergency power and scarce resources.
2. Apply lessons learned on how catastrophic damage to the community impacted a hospital's ability to staff their hospital over the first 72 hours.
3. Review key issues in preparing for a mass casualty event involving pediatric patients.
4. Integrate awareness of regional resources for disaster response into planning activities.
5. Apply strategies for staff and patient communications during disasters.
6. Review key security and operational challenges to hospitals in mass shooting events.
