Consent/Consumer Acceptance --</p> <p>a) Patients are concerned about privacy after VA and other events</p> <p>b) Consumers must agree to new technology</p> <p>c) Patients don't feel that they have a choice</p> <p>d) Medical community must push education to secure agreement of patients</p> <p>e) Who is receiving this information and why?</p> <p>f) What is the measure of success or effectiveness? People are only hearing the negative and we need to market the benefit</p> <p>g) How do tell the public that it saves lives (increases quality of care) and decreases costs (increases efficiency)</p> <p>h) How is consent interacting with patient care? (4 types of consent – research, basic service & payment, patient bill of rights, and NPP)</p> <p>I) Differences between HIPAA and state (MN doesn't allow verbal authorization and HIPAA does)</p> <p>J) Must build trust with examples</p>
