Included below is information about the panelist's background as it relates to health information technology.

Panelists

Virginia Greenman, Consumer Representative

Ms. Greenman worked in health and human services for over 20 years. She has served as the consumer representative on the Minnesota Health Care Commission as well as on the board of directors at the Neighborhood Healthcare Network, the Hamm Clinic and Stratis Health. She has also represented consumers on the American Health Quality Association (AHQA) board which represents the Quality Improvement Organizations and professionals working to improve the quality of health care in communities across America.

Jim Lyons, Administrator, Hutchinson Medical Center (HMC)

HMC is a physician owned multispecialty clinic in central Minnesota with over 150 employees and 31 providers. In addition to the outpatient clinic, HMC provides services in the local hospital and several skilled nursing facilities. HMC's EMR planning officially started in October 2005, selection of a system in June 2006, and "Go-live" in September 2007. HMC is currently planning a version upgrade and fine tuning work flows.

Noel Peterson, MD, Physician, Olmsted Medical Center

Olmsted Medical Center (OMC), a not-for-profit organization, has 149 clinicians and nearly 1,000 healthcare professionals serve at 14 locations, including a multi-specialty clinic, a hospital with walk-in urgent care and 24-hour emergency room, and 10 community branch clinics. Dr Peterson was OMC's President in 2001 when OMC began implementation of an EHR as a beta site.

Peter Schuna, CEO/Administrator, Cerenity Senior Care - Humboldt Campus

Cerenity Senior Care - Humboldt Campus (non-profit) is a 14-acre campus with Skilled Nursing, Transitional Care, Assisted Living and Independent Senior Living. Cerenity Senior Care has been utilizing an EHR since August of 2006, with Point of Care kiosks that allow almost real-time data to be integrated into the EHR. Cerenity's current EHR lacks decision support Tools, rich data reports, and interoperability--all of which are part of planned enhancements for the future.
