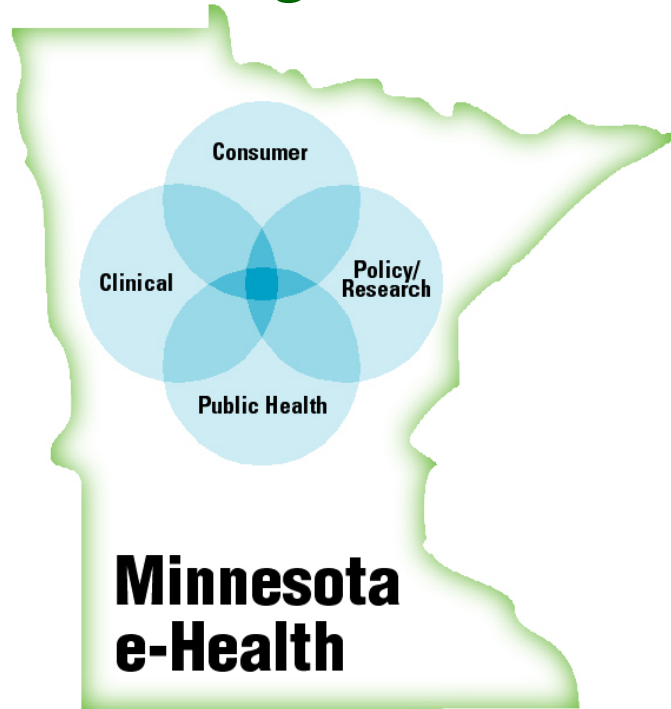

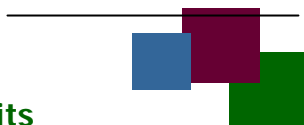
Audience

Minnesota e-Health Summit 2007 is intended for anyone working on local or regional health information exchange and for anyone planning or implementing health information technology. The content is relevant for professionals working in clinics, hospitals, long-term care, public health, health systems, managed care, and information systems.

Summit Objective

The purpose of the Summit is to showcase how national and Minnesota e-Health initiatives are working to empower consumers, inform and connect clinicians, and protect communities.

The Pre-Summit Workshop will give participants knowledge and skills for seeking Health Information Technology (HIT) funding. In addition, participants will learn about resources available to assist in planning and implementing an HIT strategy for their organization.

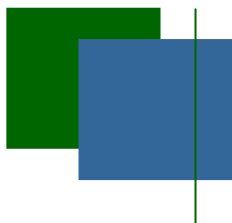
