## 1. World Day for Prevention of Child Abuse , November 19, 2007

A coalition of nonprofits will be coming together on November 19, 2007 in Saint Paul, Minnesota to join with 783 Coalitions located in 183 Countries in honoring the "World Day for Prevention of Child Abuse." This is Minnesota's second year in adding our voices to the collective world's plea to end child abuse world wide. The Women's World Summit Foundation (WWSF) chose November 19th to focus on prevention of child abuse and to increase the public's awareness of how to help. Launched in 2001, WWSF was formed as an international non-governmental (NGO) coalition that encourages every state and country to support efforts to end child abuse. This year, four different Minnesota-based agencies, including the Jacob Wetterling Foundation www.jwf.org (http://www.jwf.org/), National Association to Prevent Sexual Abuse of Children (NAPSAC) www.napsac.us (http://www.napsac.us/), Neighborhood House www.neighb.org (http://www.neighb.org/), Prevent Child Abuse Minnesota www.pcamn.org/), are working together to mark this important day, to call our citizens to action and to provide safety tips to help families.

Green Mill Pizza will be providing pizza coupons for participants who take time at the table together to talk about safety messages and abuse prevention as a family following the event. ## 8. Report on the Health of Minnesota College Students

"A report released by the University of Minnesota Boynton Health Service is the state's first ever study to take a comprehensive look at the health of college and university students. It examines everything from mental health and obesity to financial health and sexual health. Dr. Ed Ehlinger, the director and chief health officer of the Boynton Health Service, said members of the public, higher education leaders and state leaders should pay attention to the findings and make the health of college students a priority."

Included in the report... "Sexual violence: More than one in five or 22.4 percent of female students report experiencing a sexual assault in their lifetime with 6.8 percent reporting having been assaulted in the last 12 months. For male students, only 4.9 percent report being sexually assaulted in their lifetime with 1.9 percent reporting an assault within the past 12 months. Such assaults have lingering impact on students and their academic performance, Ehlinger said. Students who have been victims of sexual assault report higher rates of depression."

This is ironic since alcohol is strongly correlated with several undesirable sexual outcomes, including sexual dysfunction, lessening of physical sensation, improper contraceptive usage, flawed evaluation of sexual situations, and the 900-pound gorilla of the bunch--sexual assault....." PROGRAM: NO ZEBRAS: NO EXCUSES No Zebras is the first program to focus on bystander mentality, addressing the impact of intervention on situations of sexual aggression. It stresses sexual aggression can no longer be ignored, empowering students to stand up, take a stand, and help keep others safe! These vignettes are required for all incoming freshman students at Central Michigan University. Each vignette is performed by members of the nationally recognized group Sexual Aggression Peer Advocates and each topic is supplemented by current statistical information. No Zebras is facilitated by Steve Thompson, sex crimes profile and author of No More Fear and Date/Acquaintance Rape: The Crime and Criminal the most comprehensive profile and behavior pattern of acquaintance rapists. Thompson is a national figure on the subject of sexual assault, harassment, and stalking. Preliminary evaluation (
