[A Collaborative Victim-Centered Response to Abuse in Later Life: Cross-training for Victim Services Providers, July-September, 2010](#)
Minnesota currently has an estimated 1.5 million people aged 50 and over. This population will continue grow and require services that meet their unique needs.
