7. Quick on-line survey about sexual violence and adolescent pregnancy

A message from: Grit Youngquist, Prevention Specialist, MDH and Marilyn Colby Rivkin, Program Manager, MOAPPP.

You are invited to participate in a quick on-line survey about sexual violence and adolescent pregnancy. The survey will take about 5 minutes. The questions focus on the training and resource needs of Minnesota professionals in youth-serving organizations. The Minnesota Department of Health's Sexual Violence Prevention Program (MDH) and the Minnesota Organization on Adolescent Pregnancy, Prevention & Parenting (MOAPPP), are conducting the survey.

Ready to take the survey?

Why this survey now? Recent research has shown that youth with a history of sexual violence during childhood and/or adolescence are at significantly increased risk for involvement in a pregnancy during the teen years. While this is true for females, the risk is greater for males, and even greater for youth who are gay/lesbian/bisexual/transgender and those questioning their sexual orientation. Findings from research and practice suggest that preventing sexual abuse and sexual violence can help prevent adolescent pregnancy.

The survey results will help MDH and MOAPPP better understand the training and resources that practitioners need to be best prepared to help prevent sexual violence and respond to youth who have experienced sexual violence. Please forward this invitation to others who you believe would be interested.
