Offender Treatment, Victim Services and Best Practices is co-sponsored by the Victim Offender Mediation Association (VOMA) and the American Association of Community Justice Professionals (AACJP). The conference will be held in Miami, Florida, June 10-14, 2006.

According to recent research from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), one out of four 8th and 9th graders reports being a victim of dating violence. Even more startling, many adolescents do not grasp the seriousness of dating abuse. CDC research shows that a majority of young people think that emotional and

verbal abuse are "normal" parts of relationships. To increase positive relationship behaviors and healthy relationships among young people ages 11-14, CDC's Division of Violence Prevention is launching the nationwide [Choose Respect campaign](#).
