2. Web Forum: Protecting Missing and Exploited Children, May 3, 2006

The Office of Victims of Crime is hosting a Web forum, *Protecting Missing and Exploited Children*, with Marc Klaas, founder of KlaasKids and co-founder of BeyondMissing, Inc.

After the death of his daughter in 1993, Mr. Klaas became dedicated to promoting programs that have a positive impact on crime, abuse, and neglect.

3. New DVD from the MN Center for Victims of Torture, *Healing and the Pursuit of Justice: Challenging Sexual Assault as a Weapon of War*

<u>Healing and the Pursuit of Justice: Challenging Sexual Assault as a Weapon of War</u> is a 34-minute DVD that provides information on the situation of women in war and its aftermath. It is a useful tool for primary care providers, therapists and staff in refugee camps who work with survivors of sexual torture and human rights advocates. The DVD includes an introduction to the issue, effects on women and efforts to prevent sexual assault and to hold perpetrators responsible. Each DVD costs \$10.00. 4. New book from Jackson Katz: The Macho Paradox

<u>Jackson Katz</u> is founder and director of <u>Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP) Strategies</u>, which is an organization that provides gender violence prevention training and materials to colleges, high schools, law enforcement agencies, the U.S. military services, community organizations and corporations. Katz has a new book out, <u>The Macho Paradox</u>.

The Macho Paradox is a wake-up call for all men, who Katz feels must take full responsibility to change the very culture that fosters and encourages abuse against women. The author seeks to reframe the national debate concerning abuse against women, and call for general awareness and action: for America to finally and rightfully make violence against women a "men's issue" as well. The book incorporates the voices and experiences of women and men who have confronted the problem of gender violence from all angles, specifically highlighting what works and what does not work in dealing with this issue. By working together as allies, Katz shows both men and women how they can end the abuse and mistreatment of women.
