4. Victimization of Persons with Traumatic Brain Injury or Other Disabilities: A Fact Sheet for Professionals

A new fact sheet, <u>Victimization of Persons with Traumatic Brain Injury or Other Disabilities</u>, is now available on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Victimization can include physical violence, sexual violence, psychological or emotional abuse, and neglect, and research indicates that persons with disabilities are at an increased risk for victimization. This fact sheet was developed for professionals to provide a comprehensive overview of the topic of victimization of persons with traumatic brain injury or other disabilities and to raise awareness about this serious and preventable public health problem.
