## ***2. Building a Bridge of Hope: Interdisciplinary Conference on Family Violence and Animal Abuse, March 29, 2007***

*Building a Bridge of Hope* is an interdisciplinary conference that will bring together national and local experts to discuss the link between animal abuse and family violence, as well as to create a coordinated, interagency response to violence in all its forms.

**Keynote Address: Phil Arkow, BA, American Humane Association & The Latham Foundation**

A growing body of research is fueling a renaissance of interest in “The Link” -- acts of cruelty to animals that are markers for violence against humans. Researchers and practitioners in human and humane services are respecting animal abuse as a significant component within the continuum of family and community violence. Animal abuse adversely affects children who perpetrate or witness it, victims of intimate partner violence, hoarders, victims of elder abuse, and the non-human members of American families.

This presentation will help professionals in such fields as social work, law enforcement, veterinary medicine, psychology and education to provide more effective multi-disciplinary interventions by including animal protection organizations in community collaborations which address all forms of family violence.
