**Special Topic: "Sexual Violence Prevention Strategies and GLBT Youth"**

Presenter: Rebecca Waggoner Kloek, Anti-Violence Program Manager, OutFront Minnesota

GLBT youth often experience a higher rate of school related violence including hate/bias activity and sexual assault. Developing and implementing effective strategies to increase the physical safety of GLBT youth as well as to create safe school climates for these youth is crucial to the individual as well as the community.

This workshop will explore basic language and terms commonly used to describe the GLBT communities as well as the unique barriers that GLBT youth in particular often face when interacting with systems professionals, service providers and the larger community. This interactive workshop will discuss methods for addressing school climate safety issues including developing positive and affirming school policy, "coming out" and other important facets of GLBT sexual identity development, working within existing sexual violence prevention strategies to ensure inclusion of GLBT youth, and, finally, the identification and/or development of student-led activities, such as GSAs, in order to address the root causes of the variety of oppressions that GLBT students often encounter.

## 6. Pornography and Pop Culture: Reframing Theory, Re-thinking Activism, March 23-27, 2007

March 23-25, 2007, Wheelock College, Boston, MA

The so-called "porn wars" that were fought over the feminist critique of contemporary mass-marketed pornography derailed important academic and activist work. It is time to move on by reframing our thinking on pornography, especially in light of the important changes that have occurred in both technology and pop culture over the past two decades. In the world of the internet, cell phone porn, Howard Stern and "Girls Gone Wild," the central insights of the critical feminist perspective are more important than ever. What was once called soft-core pornography has become the norm in mainstream pop culture, while hard-core porn has become increasingly accepted and increasingly misogynistic. What do such economic and cultural shifts mean for feminist theory and activism, and how can we rebuild a vibrant feminist movement that addresses the harms of misogynist images that help define our culture, our visual landscape and our sexuality? These issues will be addressed at a national conference on March 23-25, 2007, at Wheelock College in Boston. Titled "Pornography and Pop Culture: Reframing Theory, Rethinking Activism," this conference will (1) feature recent feminist theory and research on pornography, prostitution and pop culture, and (2) provide space for collaborative discussion on how to prepare the ground for building a broad-based, energized and vibrant feminist movement that can address the harms of pornographic images in the context of a more general political and cultural crisis. Speakers will include Robert Jensen, Associate Professor of Journalism, [University of Texas](http://www.utexas.edu) and Melissa Farley, Director, [Prostitution Research and Education](http://www.prostitutionresearch.org), San Francisco.

Auriton Solutions® is an accredited nonprofit agency based in Roseville, MN primarily serving individuals with an immediate need to resolve issues with potential foreclosure or issues with credit card debt and collections. The staff at Auriton assist individuals and families dealing with challenges in all parts of their personal finances, however, a key aspect of Auriton's services is foreclosure prevention and housing counseling.

Auriton Solutions is one of four nonprofits that have partnered with the Homeownership Preservation Foundation (HPF) in an effort to assist homeowners who are experiencing financial hardship with their mortgage payments. Their mission is to provide free local and nationwide housing counseling to homeowners to ensure they are receiving sound recommendations and support for their specific financial situation.
