What Services are Staying at New Ulm


Current Services:

- E.D Psychiatric Consultation for mental health patients in crisis
- Masters Prepared Clinical Staff that provide assessments, brief treatment, requests for inpatient admission and/or transfers to out-patient services
- Support from clinical social workers

 Partial Hospital and Day Treatment Program that will meet the needs of individuals who have a mental illness and addiction need for care.

Looking Ahead

NUMC is planning to repurpose the residential unit space for a new partial hospitalization and day treatment (intensive outpatient) program to serve this region. We are working diligently to operationalize this and hope to begin accepting referrals in early 2024.


