




Growing Needs, Declining Capacity:


Job vacancy rates in healthcare occupations across MN

Announcement:

• On April 2, 2024, Lakewood Health System announced that its Inpatient Behavioral Health Unit was closing.

Staffing

- 24 Lakewood Health System employees were impacted by this decision.
- A plan was developed to transition Lakewood Health System employees to other appropriate roles across the organization.
- All Lakewood Health System employees who elected to stay with the organization have been offered positions and redeployed to areas that directly serve community needs assisted living, long-term care, and hospital services.



Patients:

- Census: When the announcement was made, there were four patients in the unit.
- Discharged: Patients were provided quality care until they were all discharged.


