# 4732.#### SERVICE PROVIDER QUALIFICATIONS.

Subpart 1. Qualified expert. A qualified expert registered to provide physics services

must be certified by at least one of the following organizations in the appropriate fields or

specialties in which services are provided:

- A. the American Board of Medical Physics;
- B. the American Board of Health Physics;
- C. the Canadian College of Medical Physics;
- D. the American Board of Radiology; or
- E. the American Board of Nuclear Medicine Science.

### Subp. 2. Qualified medical physicist. A qualified medical physicist registered to provide

#### medical physics services must:

- <u>A.</u> be certified in diagnostic radiological physics or radiological physics by the
  <u>American Board of Radiology, or in diagnostic imaging physics by the American</u>
  <u>Board of Medical Physics, or in diagnostic radiology physics by the Canadian</u>
  <u>College of Physicists in Medicine; or</u>
- <u>B.</u> have a graduate degree in medical physics, radiological physics, physics, or other
  relevant physical science or engineering discipline from an accredited institution.
