
REHS/RS Title and Credential Usage Survey Results

Do you hold the Registered Environmental Health Specialist/Registered Sanitarian (REHS/RS) credential?






If you do not currently hold the REHS/RS credential, do you plan to apply for it in the future?


Is your REHS/RS credential through MDH, NEHA, and/or another state? (Choose all that apply)







When meeting with others within the environmental health profession, I tell them that my professional job title is:


When meeting with the public, I tell them that my professional job title is: (Respondents could only choose a single response)






Do you include REHS/RS credential initials in your signature (such as on business card or email)?


Which credential initials do you prefer to use (such as on business card or email)?




