What are the data that support the importance of doing this work in our communities? (Quantitative)

What are the stories that support the importance of doing this work in our communities? (Qualitative)

Which data and stories do we prioritize so we can paint a clear picture of why this work is important and how our proposed project will help us reach our goals/outcomes?

How do we evaluate what we do?

What are we trying to change? How are we defining success for our proposed project?

How will we know that we are making progress toward our goals?

- Oftentimes, developers of evidence-based and promising models already specify evaluation outcomes and indicators.
 - Advantage: They've done the work for you! Disadvantage: The outcomes are not always the ones you or your stakeholders want.
- What evidence can we show that we have achieved our outcomes?
