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About the Directory

This directory was created as a handout for the Black Birth Summit (BBS) held on September 17, 2019 sponsored by the Minnesota Department of Health’s Center for Health Equity (CHE) and Community Voices and Solutions (CVAS). It contains the names and contact information of individuals who registered for the summit and who agreed to have their information included in a directory. CVAS is the community leadership team of CHE’s African American Infant Mortality Project funded by the federal Office of Minority Health. Members organized the event after expressing concerns about the dearth of information regarding infant mortality work around the state, and the need to work more collaboratively rather than in silos. This directory is a starting point for organizations to connect with one another and understand how our collective strengths and resources can lead to sustainable change.
