Violence Against Asian Women and Children Working Documents

Working Group Duties

Subd. 3. **Duties.** (a) The working group must study the nature, scope, and prevalence of violence against Asian women and children in Minnesota, including domestic violence, trafficking, international abusive marriage, stalking, sexual assault, and other violence.

- (b) The working group may:
 - Evaluate the adequacy and effectiveness of existing support programs;
 - Conduct a needs assessment of culturally and linguistically appropriate programs and interventions;
 - 3. Identify barriers in delivering services to Asian women and children;
 - Identify promising prevention and intervention strategies in addressing violence against Asian women and children; and
 - Propose mechanisms to collect and monitor data on violence against Asian women and children.

STUDY PROMOTION, MARKETING

STATEWIDE Sample

• Mail to a sample of all Asian women 18-64 years old in MN

HARD-TO-REACH Sample (metro only)

- Collect data from women who are the least likely to answer a mailed survey:
 - Newest immigrants
 - Least acculturated
 - Less likely to trust a random survey
- Locations and partners in metro area that reach target women

Interviews & Focus Groups

• e.g., Asian patriarchal control, child marriages, sex trafficking
