- Options available to immigrant victims, what documents are needed for each, and considerations for determining when a referral to an immigration attorney may be needed.

Domestic Violence Personalize Safety Plan

This fillable template from the National Center on Domestic and Sexual Violence is a useful tool for safety planning with victims of domestic violence at various stages of their relationship. It includes planning for safety during a violent incident, safety when preparing to leave, safety in one's own residence, safety with an Order of Protection, safety while working or in public, safety in the context of drugs or alcohol use, and emotional health.

The Danger Assessment (https://www.dangerassessment.org/)

The Danger Assessment is a tool designed to help determine the level of danger a victim of abuse may be in. Specifically, it is designed to evaluate the risk of a victim being killed by their intimate partner. It is free, available in a variety of languages, and offers guidance for scoring and interpreting results.
