Improvements to Eden Prairie food shelf make waves in the community

In Eden Prairie, improvements to the People Reaching Out to People (PROP) food shelf not only were pleasing to the eye by improving how fresh foods were displayed, the changes were also welcomed by pantry visitors.

It began with the idea to expand and improve the PROP pantry, where clients can pick out their own food in an area within the facility. There were funds for construction, but the facility needed help filling the new space with supplies to display and promote healthy food choices such as shelving, baskets and signage.

Hennepin County Public Health Promotion and the Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP) supported these efforts, which was instrumental in helping create a bright, inviting space for pantry patrons. Among the new amenities included a new name – the Fresh Choice Market – and signs that welcomed visitors in eight different languages.

PROP has a number of regular clients, including an older Russian couple who typically left all communications to the wife while her husband remained silent. That changed when the new signage went up. While the man still said nothing, upon noticing the new sign he alerted his wife, pointed to the sign and smiled in response to the "welcome" – in Russian – visible to visitors.

PROP proved a small change can be a welcome one, making a big impact and going a long way to help people feel included and accepted.
