Parkview Villa: Protecting residents from secondhand smoke

A partnership between Anoka County Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP), American Lung Association (ALA) and local property managers is creating healthier housing options for Anoka County residents.

Since 2016, 20 properties have worked together to promote quitting smoking to residents and discuss smoke-free policies. Thirteen of the properties have implemented new smoke-free policies and five have received support for the enforcement and sustainability of existing policies. Over 4,000 residents have benefitted from tobacco-free housing work in Anoka County.

Parkview Villa in Columbia Heights is one of the properties to benefit from the partnership. Property managers worked with residents to bolster the enforcement of their existing smoke-free policy and increase the smoking set-back zone to 50 feet from the property.

In spring 2018, Heidi Larson, a Health Promotion Manager with ALA, met with the Parkview Villa resident council to learn about the issues regarding smoking in and around the building. Larson also hosted an educational session for residents about the dangers of smoking and provided resources to support quitting. By the end of the summer, the policy was updated, and new signage was posted to clarify the boundaries on the property.

"Many of the residents at Parkview Villa are seniors and individuals with disabilities," said Rochelle Holmes, Parkview Villa Assistant Site Manager. Holmes noted that all 175 residents, five staff members, and frequent guests benefit from the smoke-free policy and tobacco cessation resources.

"We are grateful to SHIP and the American Lung Association for supporting us in making this change. Without their encouragement and resources, it would have taken much longer to realize our goal."
