Students grow their own fresh produce and eat it, too

Staff at Bruce Vento Elementary in Saint Paul are finding that when students grow their own fruits and vegetables, they will more likely eat them.

That's the idea behind Saint Paul Public School (SPPS) Nutrition Services' support of "Grow Our Own" initiative, which was created to increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables and expand opportunities for handson learning with school-based gardens. Research has shown that school food directly affects students' health, learning and lifetime wellness habits.

SPPS Nutrition Services Department made the commitment to create a school garden program for the district and with SHIP funding brought on a consultant in 2017. That work directly paved the way for the launch of "Grow Our Own."

This initiative has leveraged an additional \$200,000 through the Cargill Foundation to continue program expansion that focuses on increasing access to nutritious food, improving academic achievement and increasing equitable access to science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) opportunities with school gardens as a teaching platform.

Many of the strategies that the district has proposed with the "Grow Our Own" initiative have already been tested with a school agriculture partnership at Bruce Vento Elementary. In the last two years, that school has successfully implemented a school garden and used it to teach students how to properly grow, harvest and prepare much of the produce so that it may be eaten in a variety of taste-testing opportunities.


