Hermantown becomes regional leader for tobacco prevention

Hermantown became the first city in northeastern Minnesota to ban all tobacco sales to those under 21, with the support of Healthy Northland, the Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP) grantee in Northeastern Minnesota.

Just over a year ago, community advocates in Hermantown started talking about taking action on the issue. After years of declining tobacco use rates among youth in Minnesota, they were concerned about the sharp increase in the use of tobacco and e-cigarettes among teens. According to the Minnesota Student Survey, 19.5 percent of 11th graders in the Hermantown School District use ecigarettes.

The community coalition in Hermantown began meeting monthly, with support and technical assistance from Healthy Northland's SHIP partner, the American Lung Association. The coalition planned community and school education efforts and met with city council members to inform them about tobacco issues. Hermantown students played a big role in the coalition, putting together a student advocacy group, Hawks for Health, and planning school activities to promote the effort.

Although city leaders initially resisted, fearing that raising the minimum age to purchase tobacco would be seen as anti-business, they came around because of the community support created by the groups pushing for change. In November 2018, Hermantown passed the "Tobacco 21" policy unanimously. The policy took effect Jan. 1, 2019.

Hermantown has become a regional leader in this effort, and had its neighbor, Duluth, paying attention. After watching Hermantown, supporters in Duluth knew it could be done. Duluth passed Tobacco 21 in January 2019.
