Detention center and food shelf partnership expand food access

Across the state, many communities have made great strides in making healthy eating more accessible to their community members through partnerships with schools, farmers markets and food shelves.

In Steele County, an increasing number of residents rely on the Steele County food shelf to meet basic grocery needs. A recent survey of Steele County Food Shelf customers revealed that residents do not eat as healthy as they could because healthy food costs more.

To address this barrier, the Steele County Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP) staff collaborated with the Steele County Detention Center (SCDC) to expand their garden to provide affordable, fresh produce for the food shelf. The garden at the SCDC is part of a rehabilitative program for inmates, helping them learn about serving their community as well as how to grow fresh produce.

SHIP funds supported the purchase of a new tiller for the garden, allowing continued expansion. SCDC Program Coordinator, Cynthia Fowler, commented about the impact on the inmates, "This tiller has been a godsend. It's that feeling of family. All these little things help to give them hope."

SHIP also helped to bring in a local farmer to help with planting, harvesting and other assistance to increase growing capacity. SHIP supported SCDC in creating the policy changes necessary to gain approval from both jail administration and the Steele County board.

With new garden equipment and a renewed sense of excitement about the project, the detention center increased the amount of produce grown and donated 1,814 pounds of food to the food shelf with 610 pounds of food to be used for the inmates at the SCDC.
