Increasing breastfeeding-friendly practices across Wright County

Breastfeeding is the ideal way to ensure that babies receive optimal nutrition during the first years of life, but families sometimes face barriers that make breastfeeding challenging.

In 2013, Wright County Public Health, with the support of the Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP), began training childcare providers on how to support families to continue to breastfeed when moms returned to work. In 2016, Wright County partnered with Allina-Buffalo Hospital to implement the area's first Baby Café. Since then, more than 200 breastfeeding moms and babies have received support from their peers and Certified Lactation Counselors. The success of the Baby Café and childcare provider trainings have built momentum around breastfeeding support at the local health department, workplaces and child care settings.

By 2018, Wright County Public Health was recognized as a gold level Breastfeeding Friendly Health Department by the Minnesota Department of Health. St. Michael-Albertville School District, Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted School District and Wright County have also been recognized and Monticello School District is in the process of applying. Added together, these workplaces employ approximately 820 women of childbearing age.

The Breastfeeding Friendly Childcare designation was also given to seven local child care businesses in 2017 and 2018: Tri-Valley Migrant Head Start (Monticello); Early Childhood Family Education (Monticello); Big Woods Childcare (Delano); Kid's Haven (Buffalo); and three home-based child care facilities in Rockford, Delano and Otsego. All together, these locations impact 832 children from birth to age five.

"Receiving support not only in my home, but also within the community, potential child care locations, and at work is immeasurably helpful in ensuring I can give my child the best possible start to life," said local mother Kristie Rathmanner.


