Minnesota Statutes, section 144.565 requires submission of annual diagnostic imaging utilization and services information to the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH). MDH collects this information through the Health Care Cost Information System (HCCIS) on the Diagnostic Imaging Facility Utilization and Services (DI) report. This letter outlines the reporting requirements for the 2020 report which is **due March 1, 2021**.

The requirement to submit diagnostic imaging utilization and services information pertains to **all** entities that **own or lease** equipment used for providing advanced diagnostic imaging services through the use of ionizing radiation or other imaging techniques using fixed, portable, or mobile equipment. This includes Cone Beam Computed Tomography (CBCT) used by Dental service providers.

MDH **requires** the use of an electronic formset in completing the DI report. Many of the fields are automatically calculated and have built-in logic checks that will save time and reduce the possibility of errors. The 2020 formset and instructions can be downloaded from the [HCCIS website](http://www.health.state.mn.us/data/economics/hccis/forms.html#dds) (www.health.state.mn.us/data/economics/hccis/forms.html#dds).

Also, note that Minnesota Statutes, section 62J.17 requires the **annual** submission of major capital expenditure commitments. Providers should include this information with the submission of each facility's DI report.

Please include your facility's HCCIS ID (assigned by MDH and found in the formset) on all correspondence **and** when you submit the completed Excel 2020 formset by **e-mail** sent to health.hccis@state.mn.us.
