

What to expect: Visiting a Mobile Vaccine Clinic

TRANSCRIPT

Mobile vaccinations clinics bring the COVID-19 vaccine to you and your community. This video walks you through what you can expect when you visit a mobile vaccination clinic.

When you arrive at the mobile clinic you'll check in with a greeter for your vaccination appointment.

[Greeter] Hello! Alrighty, I will get you checked in today. What is your last name?

Please let them know if you need accessibility or language accommodations. Mobile vaccine clinic often have openings for walk-ins, so bring a friend!

[Greeter] You are good to go, you can head over to the line.

Wait your turn either directly outside the bus or in the waiting area on the bus.

When it's your turn to be vaccinated, sit down at a vaccination station with a clinician. There are screens available if you'd like more privacy.

[Clinician] Can you tell me your name?

The clinician will go over your information with you and you can ask any questions you may have about the vaccine.

The clinician will need access to your upper arm to administer the vaccine.

Once you're vaccinated, you'll exit the bus.

[Staff] Hi. Thanks so much for coming. Thanks for getting vaccinated. And now we'd like you to wait for about 15 minutes right over here in this area.

You'll sit in the observation area for 15 minutes. And staff will explain what to do if you're not feeling well. Trained staff like nurses or emergency medical technicians are on-site if you don't feel well.

After your 15 minutes are up, you are all done!

Thank you for getting vaccinated.
