MLS Laboratory Update:

APRIL 21, 2023

Purpose of this Message:

To notify CLIA-certified and CLIA-waived entities of updated reporting requirements for SARS-CoV-2 test results under MN state law, effective May 12, 2023.

Action Item:

Review this information and forward to your associated clinics and system partners. Please update your informatics team on changes that may be needed to electronic results reporting.

Background:

Reporting of SARS-CoV-2 laboratory test results to MDH has been required since March 27, 2020, under a federal COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) Statement of Administration Policy - H.R. 382 H.J. Res. 7 (https://www.whitehouse.gov/wp-content/uploads/2023/01/SAP-H.R.-382-H.J.-Res.-7.pdf). The federal COVID-19 PHE will be ending on May 11th, 2023. The end of the PHE also ends the CARES Act authority for Health and Human Services (HHS) to require test result reporting. On April 20, 2023, the Commissioner of Health ("Commissioner") issued a Supplemental Notice of Test Result Reporting for SARS-CoV-2 under part 4605.7080 of the Minnesota Communicable Disease Reporting Rule. The Notice establishes the reporting requirements for test results for SARS-CoV-2 under MN state law effective May 12, 2023. Under the Notice, state law will require reporting of only positive results from tests for SARS-CoV-2. This Notice covers CLIA-certified laboratories and entities operating under CLIA certificates of waiver. All other reporting requirements in the notice issued in December 2022 remain in effect, including the requirement to submit SARS-CoV-2 clinical materials and sequencing data, if available, and can be reviewed at: <u>Reporting of COVID-19</u>/SARS-CoV-2 under the Minnesota Communicable Disease Rules, Chapter 4605.7080 - MN Dept. of Health (https://www.health.state.mn.us/diseases/reportable/rule/process/index.html).

* As a reminder, if sequencing is performed, laboratories are also required to submit sequencing data to MDH regardless of whether the underlying test was a NAAT or non-NAAT test.
