Award Category

There are two awards presented each year in the categories listed below. The Nominating Committee will review qualifications and contributions to maternal and child health outcomes for each nominee and determine the appropriate category level. Nominators may address in their letter of support the category you feel best fits the nominee's scope of work.

STATEWIDE AWARD. This award recognizes the nominee's contributions to maternal and child health with outcomes at a statewide level.

COMMUNITY-LEVEL AWARD. This award recognizes the nominee's contributions to maternal and child health with outcomes that impact an entire community or a targeted population within a community. Describe the community or targeted population.

Description/Contributions of the Nominee

1. Describe the nominee's qualifications as a recognized expert or authority, and/or long-term involvement, in their particular area of maternal and child health.

2. Describe the outcomes that demonstrate the nominee's contributions in any or all of the following areas:
 - A. Advancing or improving the health status of mothers or children in Minnesota on a community or statewide basis.
 - B. Developing successful, innovative program(s) in maternal and child health in Minnesota.
 - C. Advocating for maternal and child health with decision-making bodies (*i.e.*, legislative bodies, corporations, school boards).
 - D. Collaborating with health, education, social services, other decision makers and service providers.
