

Grant Support for Grieving Parents and Caregivers Experiencing the Death of an Infant or a Stillbirth in Minnesota

	Program Summary
Eligibility for Grant Funds	Eligible applicants may include community health boards, tribal nations, and non-profit organizations.
Total Funds Available Per Year	Funding is currently available for \$130,000 per year for three years . The contract may be extended contingent on the availability of funds. Only one applicant will be funded.
Grant Cycle	August 31, 2019 – July 1, 2022
Grant Purpose	The purpose of the RFP is to fund one organization with the capacity and expertise to directly provide an initial bereavement consultation statewide to grieving parents or caregivers who have experienced an infant loss or stillbirth in Minnesota. Priority will be given to an organization with experience providing grief and loss support services. The organization awarded this grant must, upon completion of the contract, be ready to immediately serve families statewide by coordinating resources, services, and related activities as appropriate.
Application Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Documents required for application submission are listed on the Form G: Grant Application Checklist in the application packet. ▪ Project narrative excluding the work plan should be a maximum of 10 pages, 12-point font, one-inch margins, and single-spaced. ▪ All pages must be numbered consecutively. ▪ Submitted proposals must use all forms provided in the application packet.
