Minnesota care coordination effectiveness study

About care coordination

- About 400 of 700 primary clinics are certified as Health Care Homes
- Care coordination for complex high-cost patients is 1 of 5 required standards
- Systematic reviews of care coordination studies show benefits for some patients, but we don't really know:
 - Which coordination strategies are best?
 - For whom?
- Two approaches to care coordination

Study aims

To compare patient outcomes for two models of care coordination: **medical/nursing** vs. **medical/social**

To identify the key components of both models that are associated with better outcomes 3

To explore how organizational, community, care process, and patient factors explain differences in outcomes



Comparators: medical/nursing vs. medical/social

The 3 criteria for the **Medical/Social** model are:

- I. At least one social worker (licensed or not) is part of the care team at the clinic, <u>and</u>
- 2. The social worker is responsible for assessing and coordinating social services for care coordination patients at the clinic, and
- 3. The social worker routinely interacts with care coordinated patients as well as their clinicians

Clinics that do not satisfy every part of this definition are considered to be using the **Medical/Nursing** model.



Study outcomes and data sources



- Care Quality (MNCM)
- Health Care Utilization (Payors)
- Patient-Reported Outcomes (Patient Surveys)



Care system/clinic recruitment (fall 2020)



By the end of the study, we hope to be able to tell you Which approach to care coordination improves care quality, utilization, and patient-reported outcomes the most?

What components of the care coordination models make the most difference in outcomes?

What types of patients benefit the most from care coordination?

How were care coordination patients affected by the COVID-19 care disruption, and were there disparities in services or impacts?
