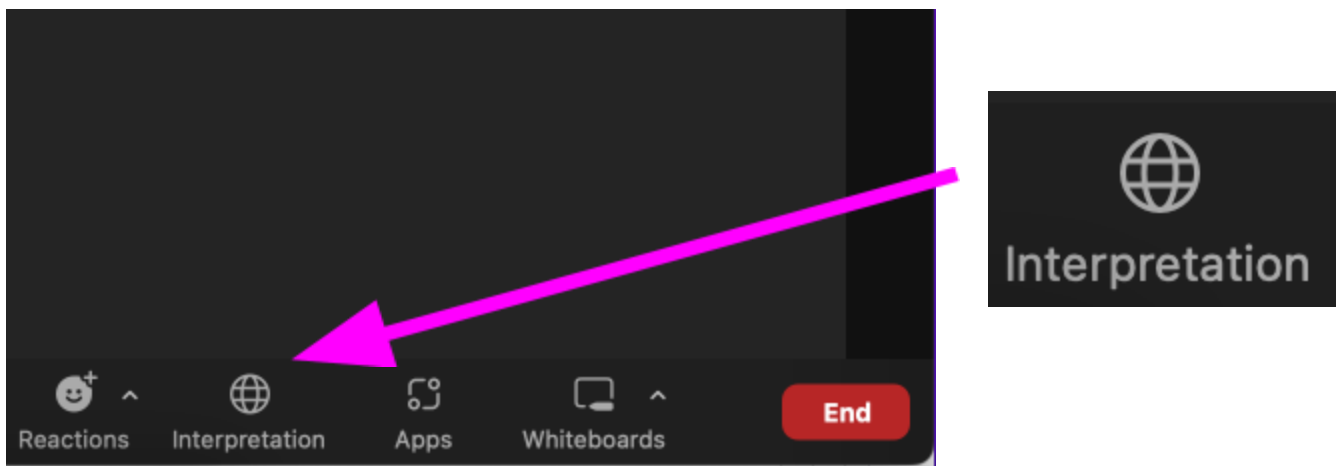
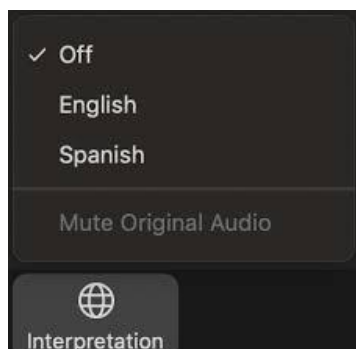


Accessing the Zoom Interpretation Feature on a Computer Windows | macOS

- 1) Once you have joined a meeting and the host has turned the interpretation feature on, you can select your language by navigating to the interpretation icon and selecting your language option. The interpreting icon will appear on the bottom right corner of the screen, close to the red 'End' or 'Leave' button.



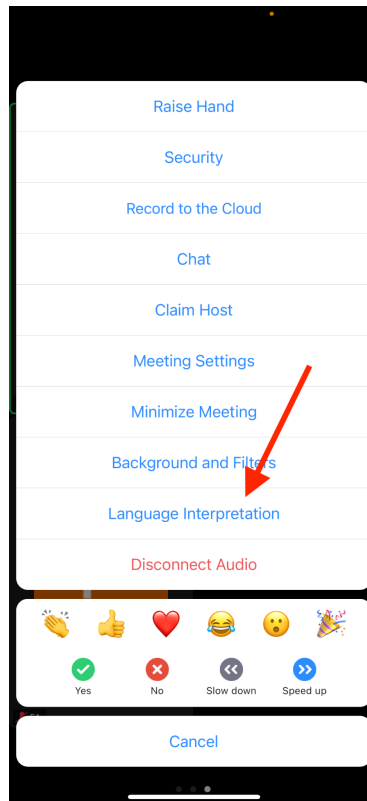
In this example we see Spanish and English are available.
You can see this in the image below.



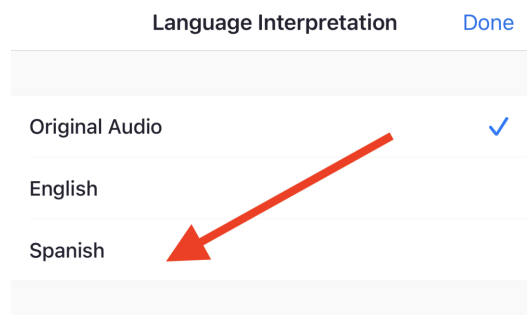
- 2) If you select Spanish as your preferred language, you will now hear the Spanish interpreter speaking. You can remain on this channel throughout the presentation.

Accessing the Zoom Interpretation feature on a Smartphone Android | iOS

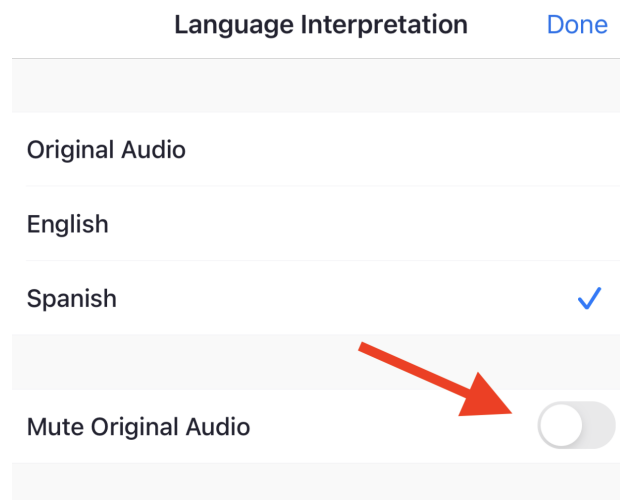
1. In your meeting controls, tap the ellipses icon: ...
2. Tap **Language Interpretation**.



3. Tap the language you would like to hear



- By default, when interpretation is active, the attendee hears 90% interpreter, 10% speaker, so that tone can be picked up on. This can be muted by toggling Mute Original Audio off (Optional).



- Click **Done**.

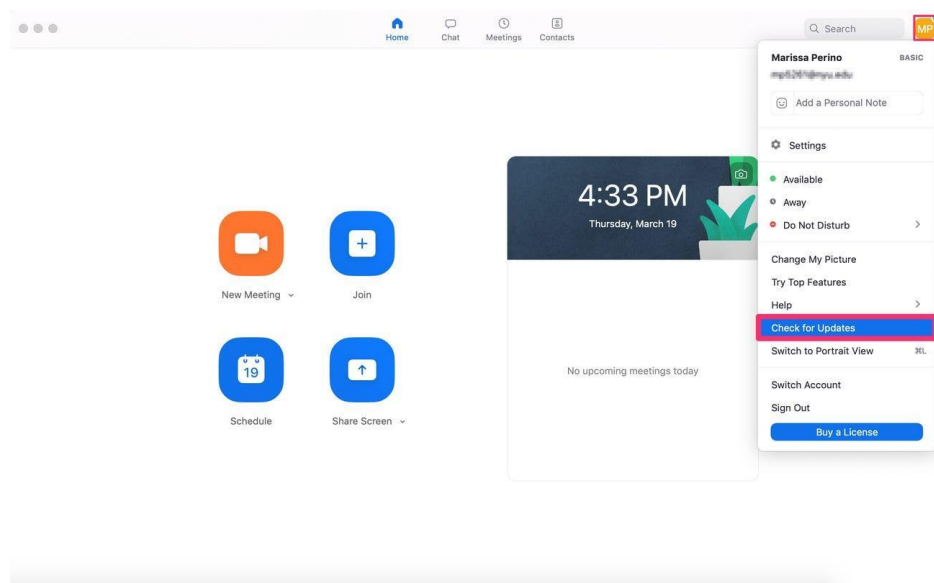
Important Information

- Make sure to join from your laptop, phone or tablet via the **Zoom App**. If you join from your browser, you won't be able to access the interpretation feature.
- Make sure your Zoom app is updated. To check for updates please follow the instructions below:

1. Open the Zoom app on your MAC or PC.

2. Click on your profile picture in the top-right corner. If you haven't changed your photo, the icon will appear as your initials inside a colored square.

3. Select "Check for updates" from the dropdown menu. If you are up-to-date with your app version, a pop-up will appear to tell you so. If you are due for an update, Zoom will automatically begin to update your app and you'll momentarily be unable to start or join calls.



4. Click "Done" to close the pop-up.
