1. [Legislative Electronic Notification Services](#) is a great place to get started because you can create a MyBills account. By doing this, it will notify you each time that a bill you are interested in has any type of action. You may also want to explore the House and Senate Mailing Lists to find out about scheduled hearings.
2. The [Minnesota State Legislature](#) page will help you find your local legislators along with information about how to contact them. By clicking on their name, you can also find out the committees they sit on or chair. Lots of useful information.
3. The Minnesota State Legislature [Committees](#) page will help you locate the names of each committee member along with the chair of the committee in both the House and Senate. In addition, it provides the standing committee schedule and committee deadlines.
4. The Minnesota State Legislature [Bills](#) page is where there is so much to learn. At the bottom, it even provides some education about the legislative process. And there is a direct link to your MyBills page.
