#### 2021 Statute 144G.83

#### <u>144G.83 Additional Training Requirements for Assisted Living Facilities with</u> <u>Dementia Care</u>

Per the law, 144G.83 Subd. 3 anyone providing or overseeing staff training pertaining to dementia care must pass a skills competency or knowledge test required by the commissioner.

#### Overview

An assisted living facility with dementia care must provide residents with dementiatrained staff who have been instructed in the person-centered care approach. All direct care staff assigned to care for residents with dementia must be specially trained to work with residents with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias. The persons providing or overseeing staff training are required per statute to have experience and knowledge in the care of individuals with dementia, including:

- two years of work experience related to Alzheimer's disease or other dementias, or in health care, gerontology, or another related field; and
- completion of **training** equivalent to the requirements in this section and successfully passing a **skills competency or knowledge test** required by the commissioner per 144G.83 Subd. 3(2).

# Who needs to successfully pass a skills competency or knowledge test required by the commissioner?

Per 144G.83 Subd. 3 **Anyone providing or overseeing staff training pertaining to dementia care** must pass a skills competency or knowledge test required by the commissioner. MDH recommends the essentiALZ® Exam from Alzheimer's Association.

# What dementia care training programs are required to ensure compliance with statute 144G.83?

- 1. Purchase the Alzheimer's Association Person-Centered Dementia Care Training Program, which includes the essentiALZ® exam.
- 2. Purchase a training program recognized by the Alzheimer's Association and essentiALZ® Exam from the Alzheimer's Association.
- 3. Purchase a curriculum review from the Alzheimer's Association and essentiALZ® Exam from Alzheimer's Association.
- 4. EduCare's 5-part Dementia Series and test.

#### **Content: Dementia Care Practice Recommendations**

- Person-centered focus
- Assessment and care planning
- Medical management
- Information, education and support
- Dementia-related behaviors
- Activities of daily living
- Workforce
- Supportive and therapeutic environment
- Transition and coordination of services
- Detection and diagnosis



#### Problem

- Providers strapped for funding
- Facilities facing staff shortages and high turnover
- When trained staff leave, facility must identify new staff member to be trained and see they receive the necessary training



### **Proposed Solution**

**Remove obstacle** to dementia training by establishing grant program to support training:

- Use dedicated revenue fund from fines
- Make grants available to:
  - Individual Professionals to complete training and competency exam
    - Individual can take training with them portability
    - Recommend two trained per facility to maintain compliance during staff turnover
  - **Organizations** to have their curriculum reviewed by the Alzheimer's Association
