

Appendix C: Patient-Reported Negative Effects from Medical Cannabis

Note: Word choice and spellings have been retained as written by respondent to avoid inadvertent mischaracterization of intent. Brackets have been used to explain words redacted to prevent individual identification or for other reasons. Negative effects are broken down into type of negative effect, and by negative effect score rating.

Access-Related Issues

1: No Negative Effects

- None but I have to drive 100 miles to obtain it which is really inconvient
- The only negative I can think of is that it's illegal on a Federal level making it hard to use in certain places. Also traveling outside the state.

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- Distance traveled to the pharmacy.
- Do to my profession I have to stop taking medical marijuana and have to start taking all the other pills again.
- It is still illegal and against workplace rule, even if never using it before or during work.
- [CANNABIS PATIENT CENTER] ran out of product, was inconvenience to me, substituted other product that did not work
- Travel to pick up in Hibbing. Some stigma..

- Traveling is an issue, of course, taste, lack of variety in products, editable, pills, . Sometimes not convenient to carry liquid with you. When titrating off of Other meds it would be nice to have the flexibility to take a brownie or the candy to get you through the ups and downs of titration. Medicine gets boring when you are under the influence 24 hours a day and you only have access to 3 delivery methods. Also vaping is heavy in the lungs. We need other items.
- While traveling to my aunts memorial service in Kansas I was unable to bring along the cannabis. This was difficult because I suddenly was forced to resort to other medication and the timing was off because the medication doesn't always work so easily at the start. I found myself experiencing some discomfort, and wasn't sure if it was the nature of the visit, (Losing my only aunt) or lack of being able to carry the cannabis out of state. Sometimes I meet supposedly intelligent people who have assumptions about cannabis, based on their own past or others and they assume using even CBD means I am stoned, which it takes some time to convince those people I use it for comfort, not to get high. We have an ignorant population in MN. It would help if people were given open

information about how medical cannabis is used and how it works, including the THC portion as well.

7: Great Deal of Negative Effects

 Considering it is still Legally Certified it is NOT Legal!! There is a huge stigma about it... Believe me, I understand! I'm doing this solely for my daughter & her PTSD. She has been Inpatient treatment at 9yrs for a year! We have tried everything!!! She had a panic attack & was brought by Ambulance to the hospital. She had THC in her system, clean of every other chemical! My Daughter was shamed & ridiculed by the hospital staff, including the Doctor!! ""Sure you are medically on Cannabis!"" He looked 25yrs old. I was insulted & shamed for going to such an inappropriate ""New way of thinking Medicine"" The Doctor advised me I should look into something else to feed my child! The doctor & 2 nurses made a comment when they found out she was really Certified for the Medication! No apologies, not even to my 11yr old Daughter. [PATIENT] is required to go to Respite twice a month & I was told by the provider she could not bring her Cannabis medication with her, because of the difficulties. She cannot have it at school if she is to accidentally to forget her dose in the morning at home, Like a Methamphetamine or any other Scheduled chemical! She cannot have her sublingual spray at school in case of a panic attack! I have to drive over an hour away to pick up her medication & sorry to say is not always easily affordable for a single parent!

 Sublingual oil works for my PTSD, but I'm still not sure about the effectiveness of vaping for me. That makes me feel 'high' which I don't like. Headache may occur on vaping for me but never on sublingual oil.
- It causes significant dry mouth, it is a risk factor for periodontal disease.
- There is a lot of social stigma regarding use.
- I have significant confusion about when/where/how I can use outside of my own home.
- It is hard to take it right away in the morning when I'm waking up. It makes a little more lethargic but I've figured out a system of to take it later, and I love the people at [CANNABIS PATIENT CENTER].
- I've gotten too tired during the day, I've gotten headaches, some lightheadedness with the [HIGH CBD PRODUCT] one.
- Mild drowsiness, fatigue
- only thing is the increased appetite during the middle of the night, but its really not a big deal.
- plastic taste
- rebound pain
- Red eyes transpation to and from clinic over eating
- Short term memory difficulty.
- Reduced fine motor control
- Sleepiness

 Increased sweating, higher anxiety kicked in towards the end of thay week. Very similar to anti depressants and anti anxiety meds in that regard.

- For migraines- I have to be very careful to stick to cbd dominant formulations because the makes headaches worse. I find [BALANCED THC:CBD PRODUCT] and [HIGH CBD PRODUCT] work very well for me.

- The THC capsules from [CANNABIS PATIENT CENTER] seem to cause some constipation.
- The high THC medicines also cause intense hunger cravings. I need to avoid gaining weight, so its negative to me. Too much CBD can make it hard to get things done, it's a tired heavy feeling.
- upset stomach, nauesa
- When I first took THC, the dosage was gradually titrated upward. Once the dosage got up to around 5 plus ml, my progress flipped and the THC had the opposite effect. I

continued to work with the pharmacists, as Leafline, to find the right dosage. That was the difficult part. There was no "danger", I found, in taking medical cannabis. Symptoms worsened, only temporarily, when the dosage got too high for me.

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- 1. Ringing and popping in the ears
- 2. Headaches when I am off the medicine or am out of supply

• If I have too much, it doesn't let me sleep right away. Its hard to sleep when the phosphenes are creating patterns, but the effect slowly calms down and I still sleep.

- It's hard using medical cannabis on the move because I don't necessarily feel comfortable driving on it even though the scientists do a very great job of removing psychoactive effects from it. by no means am I not safe on the road I just prefer to be sober when driving
- At most some paranoia
- At the beginning it took a little bit to figure out the dosing on the vape. I got too stoned a couple of times early on.
- Can't be driving when you medicated ,because you had a panic attack.
- Care less about things, sort of disconnected.
- Experienced anxiety at first but that is less now
- I am more forgetful
- I notice at the end of the day when the effects of my meds are starting to wear off I do become forgetful. Maybe ill I misplaced my car keys and spend 5 minutes looking for them, or perhaps I will forget to brush my teeth before bed. It could also be I am just tired from the day as well. I would like to comment that any negative side effects of this

medication I have found to be insignificant compared to the great deal of positive side effects I have experienced.

- I took a product that was too high in the at the time and got paranoid
- If I'm not careful I lose ambition and motivation. Medicating appropriate amounts at the appropriate time is key.
- It has been more difficult to get out of bed some days.
- It has been more of [PATIENT]'s mindset as opposed to a negative side effect.
- mental confusion, dry mouth
- My memory hasn't been as great. That's the only complaint. (My memory has be bad anyway due to a TBI)
- occasional memory loss
- Restrictions for driving, and don't take it during work
- Some decreased short-term ability to converse actively with others right after use.
- Some rimes I want to be lazy but I overcome those feelings in seconds. Cannabis is the best treatment for my PTSD.
- Very slight memory issues. Side effects lessen as I am finding my appropriate dosage. The major barrier was making sure I continued medicating, even if I didn't like all of the side affects. I treated it the same as any other prescription.

On the previous [BALANCED THC:CBD PRODUCT] vape I hadn't had any issues. I found out that apparently there are two different kinds? One good for PTSD/panic and one not and in Minnesota they don't sort by those types. That's kind of prohibiting for me because sometimes I've noticed a difference with each kind of vape from the previous time when I get a refill, and that's frustrating because it costs so much and I can't just get two and hope that one is more effective. If that makes sense.

- While I like the fact that our available medical cannabis forms are highly tested, pure and consistent, they are borderline staid. The flavored oral solution help, as do any flavorful additions of terpenes, but one can tend to feel a more full medical effect from the flower form.
- Secondly, our local prices are getting better but are still too high. The price per mg/THC needs to come down closer to 10 cents or lower. CBD products seem fairly priced.
