

## Hemp-Derived Cannabinoid Product Event Checklist<sup>1</sup>

	Are all of the vendors who are selling hemp-derived cannabinoid products registered with the Minnesota Department of Health?
	Has the organizer received a list of products planned for sale at the event?
	Are the products for sale only compliant edibles and beverages?
	(Please refer to the Hemp-Derived Cannabinoid Product Compliance fact sheet for details.)
	Has each vendor provided a plan of securing edibles in a way that they are not accessible to customers?
	Is attendance restricted to people ages 21+?
	☐ If YES, ensure it is enforced.
	☐ If NO, ensure the vendors are held responsible for ensuring only those 21+ can purchase hemp-derived cannabinoid products.
	If the organizer is selling, distributing, or giving away any hemp-derived cannabinoid products, they must also be registered in addition to the vendors.
	If there will be onsite consumption of edibles and/or beverages, does the event organizer have an on-sale liquor license required under MS 340A?
	<b>Is there a plan for the disposal of unused or partially used</b> hemp-derived cannabinoid product?
	Has a copy of the Hemp-Derived Cannabinoid Product Compliance fact sheet been presented to all vendors or will it be made available to them before the event?
