# 2020-21 Child Care Immunization Report Summary


### 2020-21 response rate

For the 2020-21 reporting year, 1200 of 1774 (67.6%) child care centers submitted a child care immunization report to MDH. There were 50,488 children age 24 months or older who were included in these reports. The lower response rate is likely due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Possible reasons for non-reporting include temporary closure (which is not always reported) and decreased capacity to perform administrative tasks.

Child care immunization reports include hepatitis B, diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (DTaP); polio; measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR); haemophilis influenzae type B; varicella (chicken pox); and hepatitis A vaccines. This table shows the number of required doses for children age 24 months or older.


#### Immunization percentages for child care

a. The requirements differ from the immunization schedule recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) immunization schedule. The above requirements are the minimum number of doses that are required for enrollment in child care, but to be fully protected children should receive additional doses for HIB and Hepatitis A. b. If the child has had chickenpox disease, varicella shots are not required. If the disease occurred after Sept. 1, 2010, the child's doctor must sign a form.
