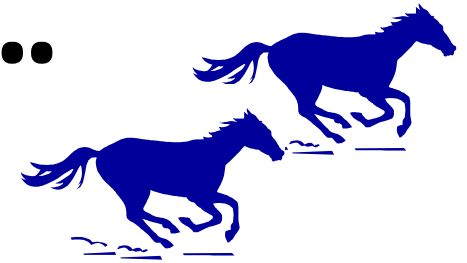


If you hear these hoofbeats...



- Sudden death in grazing animals
- Vesicular lesions in ruminants or pigs
- Acute fever, pneumonia, lymphadenitis in cats
- Fever, depression, and neurologic signs in horses
- Abortion storms in farm animals
- Rapidly spreading disease with high mortality
- Unusual disease presentation in multiple animals
- Acute disease affecting both humans and animals

... consider these zebras

- Anthrax
- Tularemia
- Plague
- Equine Encephalomyelitis
- Brucellosis
- Foot and Mouth Disease
- Unusual Disease Events
- Other potential bioterrorism agents
