## Feeding a Dependent Resident





### Resume 8/5/24

#### FEEDING A DEPENDENT RESIDENT

- 1. Perform hand hygiene.
  - a. Cover all surfaces of hands with hand sanitizer.
  - b. Rub hands together until hands are completely dry.
- 2. Explain the procedure to the resident. (Speak clearly, and directly, maintaining face-to-face contact whenever possible.)
- 3. Ask resident to state name and verify name matches the name on the diet card.
- 4. Position the resident in an upright, sitting position BEFORE feeding. At least 75-90 degrees.
- 5. Offer napkin, clothing protector, or towel to protect clothing from soiling.
- 6. Provide hand hygiene for the resident BEFORE feeding. (Candidate may use composable wipe and dispose of in trash can –or- wash resident's hands with soap and a wet washcloth or- they may rub hand sanitizer over all surfaces of the resident's hands until dry.)

- 7. Ensure resident's hands are dry BEFORE feeding. (If a wet version of the with soap was used, the candidate will need to dry the resident's hands. If a disposable with nand sanitizer was used, must make sure hands are dry.)
- 8. Place soiled linen in designated laundry hamper, or dispose to appropriate container, if used.
- 9. Sit in a chair, facing the resident, while feeting the resident
- 10. Describe the food and fluids being offered to the resident.
- 11. Offer each fluid frequently.
- 12. Offer small amounts of four at a reasonable rate.
- 13. Allow resident time & chew and wallow.
- 14. Wipe residen to and mouth AFTER the feeding demonstration.
- 15. Remove Winning protector or napkin and place in appropriate container, if used.
- 16. Leave resident sitting upright in bed with the head of the bed set up to at least 75-90 degrees.
- 17. Record estimated intake of total food consumed in a percentage on the previously signed recording form.

### Feeding a Dependent Resident Skill

#### FEEDING A DEPENDENT RESIDENT

<ul> <li>Perform hand hygiene.</li> <li>a. Cover all surfaces of hands with hand sanitizer.</li> <li>b. Rub hands together until hands are completely dry.</li> </ul>	
Explain the procedure to the resident. (Speak clearly and directly, maintaining face-to-face contact whenever possible.)	
Ask the resident to state their name and verify their name matches the name on the diet card.	
Position the resident in an upright, sitting position BEFORE feeding. At least 75-90 degrees.	
Offer a napkin, clothing protector, or towel to protect clothing from soiling.	
<b>Provide hand hygiene for the resident BEFORE feeding.</b> (Candidate may use a disposable wipe and dispose of it in a trash can –or- wash resident's hands with soap and a wet washcloth –or- they may rub hand sanitizer over all surfaces of the resident's hands until dry.)	
<b>Ensure the resident's hands are dry BEFORE feeding.</b> (If a wet washcloth with soap was used, the candidate will need to dry the resident's hands. If a disposable wipe or hand sanitizer was used, must make sure their hands are dry.)	
Place soiled linen in a designated laundry hamper or dispose in the appropriate container if used.	
Sit in a chair, facing the resident, while feeding the resident.	
Describe the food and fluids being offered to the resident.	
Offer each fluid frequently.	



## Feeding a Dependent Resident Skill

Allow resident time to chew and swallow.	
Wipe the resident's hands and mouth AFTER the feeding	
demonstration.	
Remove the clothing protector or napkin and place in an appropriate	
 container if used.	
Leave the resident sitting upright in bed with the head of the bed set	
 up to at least 75-90 degrees.	
Record intake as a percentage of total solid food eaten on the	
previously signed recording form.	
The candidate's calculation must be within 25 percentage points of	
the RN Test Observer's.	
Record estimated intake as the sum of total fluid consumed in mls on	
the previously signed recording form.	
The candidate's calculation must be within 30mls of the RN Test	
Observer's.	
Place call light or signaling device within easy reach of the resident.	



### Feeding a Dependent Resident Final Steps

Maintain respectful, courteous interpersonal interactions at all times.	
Perform hand hygiene.	
a. Cover all surfaces of hands with hand sanitizer.	
b. Rub hands together until hands are completely dry.

### Sanitize Cups

- Provide guidance how to sanitize a cup when used by student, candidate or actor
- Process decrease risk of cross contamination when using same cups with different actor's/candidates.
- All training programs and testing sites





### What is Needed for Sanitization

### **Supplies:**

- Household Dish Detergent
- Sanitization Agent/wipes
- Water



The solution must kill these viruses, identified on the sanitizer label:

### Hepatitis A

Influenza

Norovirus

- Directions sanitizing <u>food-contact surfaces</u>
- Does not require a water rinse-must contain
  - Chlorine bleach (non-scented)
  - Quaternary ammonium compounds

### **Test Day Cup Sanitization**

- Candidate will assist the actor to consume fluids from the cup <u>using a straw</u>. Each cup may have either <u>one straw each cup OR one straw between two cups</u>
- Once the test is completed, the actor will empty the cups and discard the straws
- Actor or a designee will rinse the cups with fresh water and sanitize the touch/contact/outside surfaces of the cup using a registered sanitization solution/wipe
- Let air dry
- Different actors should not use same cup unless the End of Test Day Sanitization Process was implemented



### **End of Test Day Sanitization**

- When testing is finished for the day
- Actor or a designee will wash the cups with household detergent
- Rinse with clean water
- Use the sanitizer solution and wipe all surfaces of the cup inside and out
- Once cleaned and sanitized, the cup will be left to air dry before storing or reusing the cup
- Sites may utilize commercial dishwasher if available

#### Changes to Nurse Aide Skills Test, effective Aug. 5

Nurse aide candidates will resume testing on the *Feeding a Dependent Resident* skill task that was suspended during the public health emergency.

During the public health emergency, the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) suspended some portions of the Nurse Aide Skills Test to reduce the risk of COVID-19.

Beginning Monday, August 5 nurse aide candidates will resume testing on the Feeding a Dependent Resident task, and should be prepared for it to be included as a required task on the Nurse Aide Skills Test.

Information about the task and the steps required to perform the task successfully are listed on page 43 of the Minnesota Nurse Aide Candidate Handbook. The handbook will be updated to reflect that this skill is part of the exam.

Test sites should also review the instructions for sanitizing cups after the *Feeding a* Dependent Resident skill task that have be posted on the Nurse Aide Registry Testing Information page of the MDH website.

### **Testing Information**

MDH selected D&SDT-Headmaster as the test contractor for placement on the Minnesota Nursing Assistant Registry. Testing on the Headmaster platform began on Feb. 1, 2022. Testing materials, candidate handbooks, and information about training sessions for the platform are posted on the <u>D&SDT-Headmaster - Minnesota Nurse Aide</u> website.

Registration for the Nurse Aide Skills and Knowledge tests is now open on the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MNSCU) website. Nurse Aide candidates who have completed their training program or would like to challenge the test can register for a date and time at the <u>Minnesota State Nursing Assistant Testing</u> website.

### **Oral Care**

- Providing oral care to residents in a variety of situations or conditions
- Conditions range from residents able to consume food and drink orally, to end of life cares or comatose resident
- Frequency of providing oral care
- 64% Missed



### **Bed Cradle**



- Function and purpose behind use of bed cradles in long term care facilities
- Many facilities are continuing to utilize bed cradles for patients at risk

63% missed



### **Responsibility of Nurse Aide**

- Provide quality care following care plan
- Report/share resident information with nurse
- Record/document tasks and observations
- 62% missed



### **State Tested**

- Individuals must complete testing within 24 months of training program completion date
- This information is identified in the MN Candidate Handbook in numerous areas
- 59% missed



### **Indwelling Catheter**

- 54% missed
- Provide catheter care as directed on the care plan
- Report changes to urine to the nurse



### **Skill Test Areas for Improvement**





### **Review of Skills**

- Catheter care for female and handwashing
- Assisting resident to ambulate using a gait belt
- Position resident in bed on side
- Perineal care for female and handwashing
- Vital signs: count and record resident radial pulse and respirations


### **Catheter Care for Female and Handwashing**

Overall pass rate 88.7%

- Dries equipment
- Rinses at least 4 inches away from meatus down the catheter
- While rinsing, use clean portion of washcloth for each stroke-key step
- Rinses equipment
- While washing, use clean portion of washcloth for each stroke-key step



### **Position Resident in Bed on Side**

Overall pass rate: 85.9%

- Direct RN test observer to stand on side of bed opposite working side of the bed to provide safety
- From the working side of the bed, gently moves resident's upper body, hips and legs toward self
- Place/adjust pillow under resident's head for support
- Repositions resident's arm and shoulder so resident is not lying on arm



#### Assisting Resident to Ambulate Using a Gait Belt

- Overall pass rate: 88.3%
- Provide privacy
- Locks bed brakes to ensure resident safety-key step
- Tighten gait belt
- Perform hand hygiene





### **Perineal Care for Female and Handwashing**

Overall pass rate: 89.3%

- Use clean, soapy washcloth to wash rectal area
- Wash rectal area from front to back-key step
- Use clean washcloth to rinse rectal area
- Rinse soap from rectal area from front to back

Dry equipment



#### Perineal Care for Female and Handwashing, cont

#### Use clean portion of washcloth with any stroke-key step

- Use clean washcloth for rinsing rectal area
- Use clean portion of washcloth with any stroke
- Pat rectal area from front to back





### Vital Signs: Count and Record Resident Radial Pulse and Respirations

Overall pass rate: 82.9%

- Candidate's recorded radial pulse within 4 beats of RN test observer's recorded rate-key step
- Candidate's recorded respiratory rate within 2 breaths of RN test observers recorded rate-key step
- Place call light or signal calling device within easy reach of the resident

Perform hand hygiene



## Survey Findings





Supervised practical training (SPT) means training in a laboratory or other setting in which the trainee demonstrates knowledge while performing tasks on an individual.

- May be in lab or facility
- Minimum of 16 hours
- Programs combining skills practice and SPT hours
- Hours must be clearly documented with dates and time spent



### **NA Training Supplies**

Training programs lacking sufficient training equipment

- Using elevated cot
- Lacking wheelchair
- Insufficient PPE

Refer to Nurse Aide Training Equipment (state.mn.us)



#### **Program Attendance**

Training programs lacking policy or process to document attendance, absences and ability to make up missed time





### **Questions from April Call**





#### **Question #1**

Q: If training or testing done in a LTC setting- can the cups be sent to the kitchen to be washed with other facility dishes?

A: Yes, if the facility has a commercial dishwasher, this is the preferred practice.





#### **Question #2**

Q: Is it possible to add the option to print or create a PDF of a candidate's NA certificate with the new search feature?



A: The nurse aide can print their certificate from the nurse aide search page.



#### Minnesota State Long Term Care Nursing Assistant and Home Health Aide Curriculum





#### **Current Users**

- Starting July 1, 2024, current users of the Minnesota State Long-Term Care Nursing Assistant and Home Health Aide Curriculum will not be able to access the current curriculum and will no longer be approved for use
- Minnesota State Health Care Core Curriculum/Nursing Assistant (HCCC/NA) curriculum is also being discontinued as of July 1, 2024, and will be removed from the list of Minnesota-approved curricula
- If programs choose the new version, portions of the old curriculum may not be combined with the 2024 edition



- Training programs that have declared Minnesota State Long-Term Care Nursing Assistant and Home Health Aide curriculum, have until June 30, 2024, to decide whether they will transition to the Minnesota Nurse Aide Curriculum 2024 Edition
- Training programs may choose another approved curriculum as identified on the <u>MDH approved training curricula page</u>
- Training programs choosing to use a different curriculum must notify MDH which curriculum they intend to use by emailing <u>health.nar.coord@state.mn.us</u>

### **Newly Tested Nurse Aides**



- Headmaster automatically imports data into the NAR system
- MDH receives the data 7 to 10 business days afterwards
- Recent test candidates must wait to create an account until an email from MDH have been received they've been added to the registry.
- Facilities must follow up to ensure that such an individual actually becomes registered

#### **Next Steps**

Facilities can extend the expiration date of a nurse aide's certificate based on the **Last Worked Date** with documentation to verify nursing or nursing-related services for monetary compensation for at least 8 hours during the previous 24 months. See pg. 490 of the <u>State Operations Manual (SOM) Appendix PP, Guidance §§483.35(d)(4)-(6)</u>.

Please note that nurse aides who meet the requirement of the SOM and under 42 CFR <u>483.156(c)</u> and <u>42 CFR 483.35(d)</u> can renew their certificate. Non-relating nursing services does not meet the requirement to renew.

For non-nursing home and certified boarding care homes, please advise nurse aide staff to submit a renewal application in the Nurse Aide Registry system.

#### How to Start a Nurse Aide Training Competency Evaluation Program (NATCEP)

- 1. Application packet for approval of a nurse aide training program is a fillable form and available online: <u>Nurse Aide Training and Competency Evaluation Program</u> (<u>NATCEP</u>) <u>Provisional Application Form (PDF</u>).
- 2. An approved nurse aide training and competency evaluation program must be at least 75 clock hours in length. Training includes 16 hours of supervised practical training with a live person in a laboratory or other setting and curriculum instruction/skills totaling 75 hours. Location of or method of curriculum instruction and supervised practical training identified in application packet. A list of suggested equipment is available here: <u>Nurse Aide Training Equipment (PDF)</u>
- 3. Select a curriculum from our list of approved Minnesota nurse aide training curriculums. See <u>Minnesota-Approved Nurse Aide and Training Curriculum</u>.
